Introduction: Bill 23-17, Animal Control – Performance Animal - Violations

Bill 23-17, Animal Control – Performance Animal -Violations, sponsored by Lead Sponsors Councilmembers Rice and Leventhal, is scheduled to be introduced on June 27. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for July 18 at 1:30 p.m. The sponsors of Bill 23-17 want to protect wild animals. The Bill does this by removing the financial incentives to exhibit such animals.

Bill 23-17 would:

- (1) Define the term "exhibit";
- (2) Define the term performance animal;
- (3) Prohibit the exhibition of performance animals;
- (4) Authorize the Animal Control Division to enforce prohibited act; and
- (5) Generally amend the provisions concerning animal cruelty.
