



Charlotte Hall Veterans Home
Quick Fact Sheet

- Charlotte Hall Veterans Home is a program under the MD Dept. of Veterans Affairs – George Owings was appointed by Governor Hogan to serve as Secretary in January 2015
- Opened in 1985 – celebrating 30 years of “Serving Those Who Served”
- Constructed with USDVA Funding through a grant program called State Veterans Home and Construction Grant Program – 65% funding USDVA – 35% funding State of Maryland
- 286 Skilled Nursing Beds – 168 Assisted Living Beds = 454 total beds
- Average Occupancy: 90%
- December 2014 to January 2015 – 15 Admissions, 10 Discharges, 13 Expired = 8 Net Loss
- Population is 88% male with military training
- Includes 17 female veterans and 32 female spouses
- 89% of population served during war time
- Distinguished Medal Recipients:
 - 15 Purple Heart
 - 11 Bronze Star
 - 1 Silver Star
 - 1 Distinguished Flying Cross
 - 2 POW’s

How is Charlotte Hall Veterans Home different than other nursing home facilities or assisted living facilities?

- CHVH serves veterans and their eligible spouses
- On-Site Medical Services: Attending Physicians, Nursing Practitioners, Dental, Optometry, Podiatry, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech Therapy
- On-Site Pharmacy, Pharmacist and Pharm Techs
- On-Site Barber and Beauty Shop
- On-Site Massage Therapy/Pain Management Practitioner
- On-Site Veterans Service Officer
- Robust Volunteer Program – over 20,000 hours recorded last year
- More affordable – current USDVA Per Diem Rates:
 - \$102.38 per day for Nursing Home Care = \$3,071.40 a month savings
 - \$ 44.19 per day for Assisted Living Care = \$1,325.70 a month savings
 - A VP1 – 70% or greater Service Connected Veteran may be entitled to the full cost of nursing home care.
