The program also serves students preparing to enter an Interpreter Training Program, students whose first language is ASL and who desire to learn the structure and syntax of the language, and students desiring to improve their understanding of Deaf culture to better communicate with Deaf family, friends, neighbors, and community. Associate of Arts degree program in American Sign Language is designed for students who plan to enter fields in which they would work with Deaf people on a daily basis. Following program completion, students would transfer to a four-year degree program majoring in Deaf Education, Interpreter Education, or Social Work.

Services including reasonable accommodations are provided in compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, 2009.
