Update on the ECEI Action Plan (Jennifer Arnaiz)

• Update on ongoing projects in the Action Plan

Update on Working Parents Assistance Program (WPA) (Yvonne Iscandari)

- WPA marketing campaign is underway to encourage parents to apply; commissioners are encouraged to share the <u>WPA marketing video</u> with their networks and communities
- WPA program highlights: program does not require immigration status documents so nonqualified children are eligible for WPA
- WPA is serving families up to 450% of the Federal Poverty Level
- FY22: 165 families/259 children received WPA benefits; FY23 (to date) 87 families/130 children are receiving WPA

Discussion on Child Care Workforce (led by Barbara Andrews)

- Highlighted the current minimum requirements for providers in child care centers, family child care and large family child care
- An ECEI Action Plan for FY24-27 (not yet released) is looking at a financing strategy for the child care workforce; evaluating ways to raise funds (e.g., taxes) to support the child care workforce; also looking at pay parity to help child care workforce meet public school salaries and benefits; would need to initiate a compensation study to examine salaries
