# 2018 Continuum of Care (CoC) Competition Overview

#### Overview

- HUD will be awarding approximately \$2.1 billion as part of the 2018 CoC Competition for new and renewal projects.
- Montgomery County submits a consolidated application that includes provider project applications behalf of the CoC.
- Available funding includes \$8,762,940 for renewal projects, plus \$525,776 for a CoC bonus project and \$339,704 for a Domestic Violence bonus project.
- CoCs are required to prioritize projects using a two-tiered system.
  - Tier 1 is estimated to be 94% of Annual Renewal Demand (ARD) = \$8,237,164
  - Tier 2 is equal to 6% ARD plus CoC bonus new project funds = \$1,051,552

## Montgomery CoC Priorities

- Strengthen Coordinated Entry System to rapidly move households from homelessness to housing that best meets their needs
- Expand Rapid Rehousing by 350 units
- Leverage Medicaid funding to expand PSH
- Further align our work with Housing First Principles
- Reduce length of stay in RRH to serve more households
- Refine standards for program costs improve cost effectiveness

## CoC Ranking and Review Process

- All new and renewal projects will be reviewed & ranked by the CoC Allocation Workgroup per the established CoC process
- Projects will be assessed using a standard scoring tool.
  - Housing First Addendum to assess fidelity to philosophy
  - Scoring Tools and Housing First Addendum are available on ICH website.
- The Allocation Workgroup will prioritize projects based on CoC needs, project scores and to maximize the opportunity for funding.

### Reallocation

- HUD continues to encourage CoCs to create new projects through Reallocation.
- CoC capacity to reallocate an important component of HUD scoring process
- Reallocation Options
  - Project applicants can voluntarily reallocate funds.
  - Allocation Workgroup can reallocate based on CoC need and/or project performance.
- Funds available from reallocation will be awarded on a competitive basis.

#### **Dedicated Plus**

#### Dedicated Plus Project Type

- New and Renewal PSH projects
- Expand eligibility beyond those experiencing chronic homelessness
- Include individuals or families with one adult or child with a disability who are:
  - Currently homeless, had been in PSH in past year but were unable to maintain placement, and met definition of CH at intake to PSH
  - Currently homeless, do not meet CH definition but have been homeless for at least 12 months in the past three years
  - Residing in Transitional Housing program that is being eliminated and met definition of CH at intake
- All PSH providers should convert to Dedicated Plus

### What's New?

#### Transition Grants

- Option to transition an existing one renewable project type to a new eligible project type(ex. TH to RRH).
- Provider must remain the same
- Allows for shift to new type over the course of the grant year.
- Consolidation of Existing Grants
  - Provider can combine several existing projects into a single project
  - Must be same project type and same provider

## CoC Bonus Project

- Funds totaling \$525,776 for new CoC bonus project
- Accepting applications for Dedicated Plus Permanent Supportive Housing only
- Competitive projects should include the following:
  - Ability to serve zero income participants
  - Fidelity to Housing First philosophy
  - Leverage of non-County cash resources such as Medicaid dollars
  - Cost Effectiveness

## Domestic Violence Bonus Project

- Funds totaling \$339,704 for new Domestic Violence Bonus Project
- Eligible participants must meet Category IV Homeless Definition:
  - Survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, and stalking who are fleeing violence
  - No residence
  - No resources to obtain housing
- Accepting Applications for Rapid Rehousing only
- Priority will be given to organizations who have demonstrated experiencing working with population

## Project Evaluation

- Organization Capacity and/or Past Performance
- Project Description
- Fidelity to Housing First
- Coordination with other sources and partners
- Any special populations that project is able to serve including chronically homeless, youth, veterans, domestic violence
- Participation in CoC Coordinated Entry System
- Leveraging of additional cash resources.
- Cost Effectiveness of proposed project
- Need for project within CoC

## Important Deadlines

- CoC Information Session Fri. July 20<sup>th</sup>
- Letter of Intent Due by Fri. July 27<sup>th</sup> by 5pm
- Reallocation Funding Announcement Wed. Aug 1st
- All New and Renewal Project Applications Due by Thurs. August 16<sup>th</sup> by 5 pm
- Notification of Project Selection and Priority Ranking by Tues Sept. 4<sup>th</sup>
