2023 HUD CoC NOFO Competition

HUD CoC Competition Structure

- HUD will be awarding \$3.134 billion in its CoC competition for new and renewal projects.
- Montgomery County is eligible to apply for \$9,861,899 in new and renewal projects, which may include \$690,333 for a bonus project and \$514,350 for a domestic violence bonus project.
- CoCs are required by HUD to rank its project applications using a two-tiered system. This year, HUD decided that Tier 1 would be equal to 93% of the Annual Renewal Demand (ARD), which is \$9,171,566 and Tier 2 would be equal to 7% of the ARD, which is \$690,333.
- HUD continues to encourage CoCs to create new programs through reallocation.

Support new Rapid Rehousing projects for single adults.

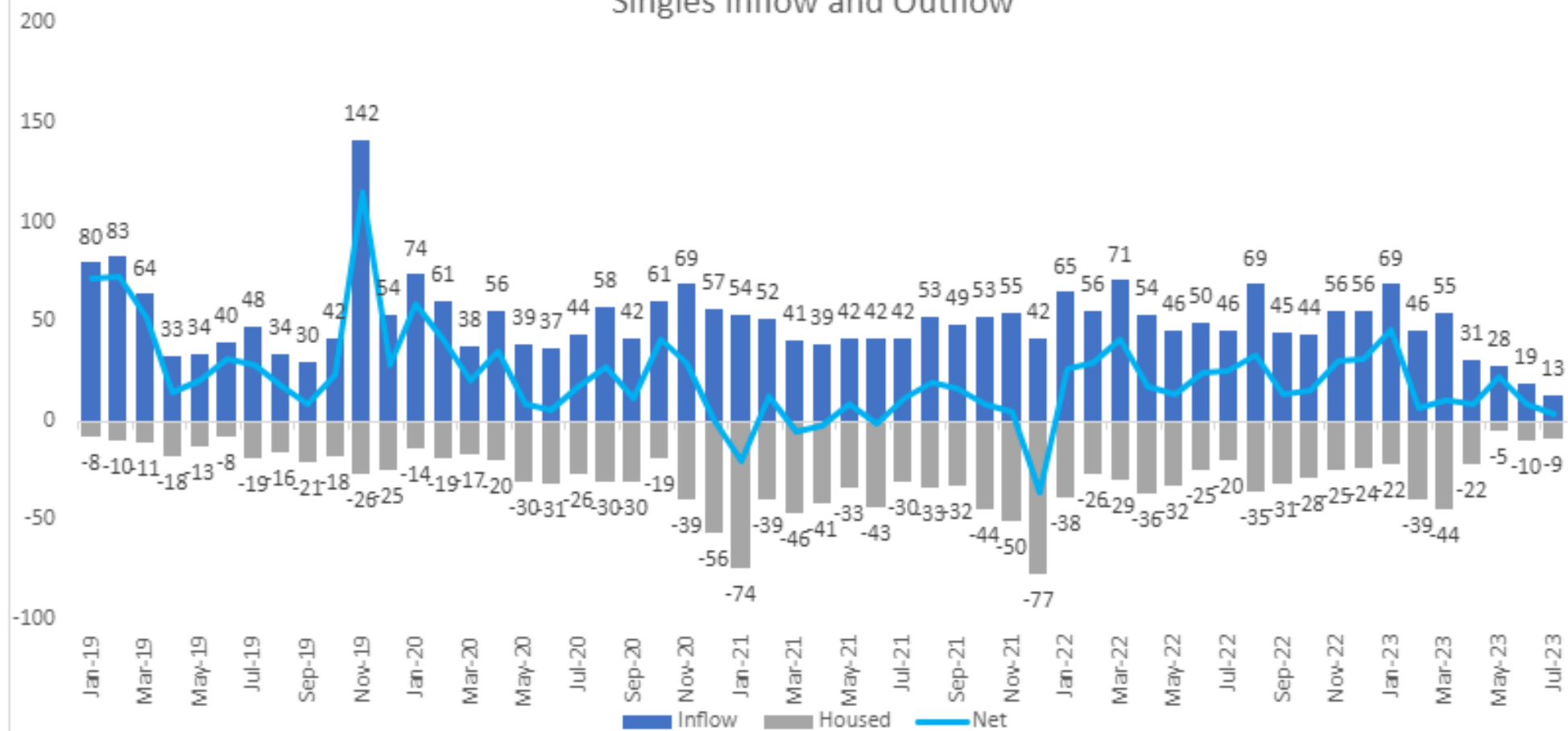


Support new Scattered-Site Permanent Supportive Housing projects that address the needs of people experiencing homelessness with low-mid intensity levels of support.

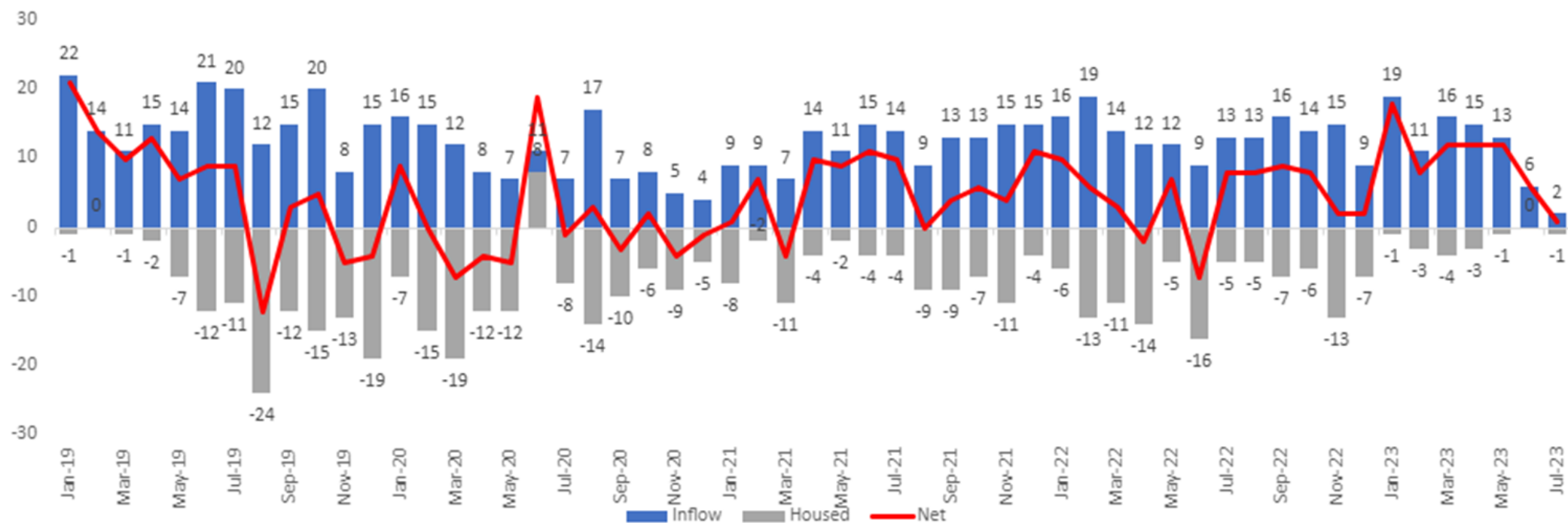


Zero for All Campaign Update

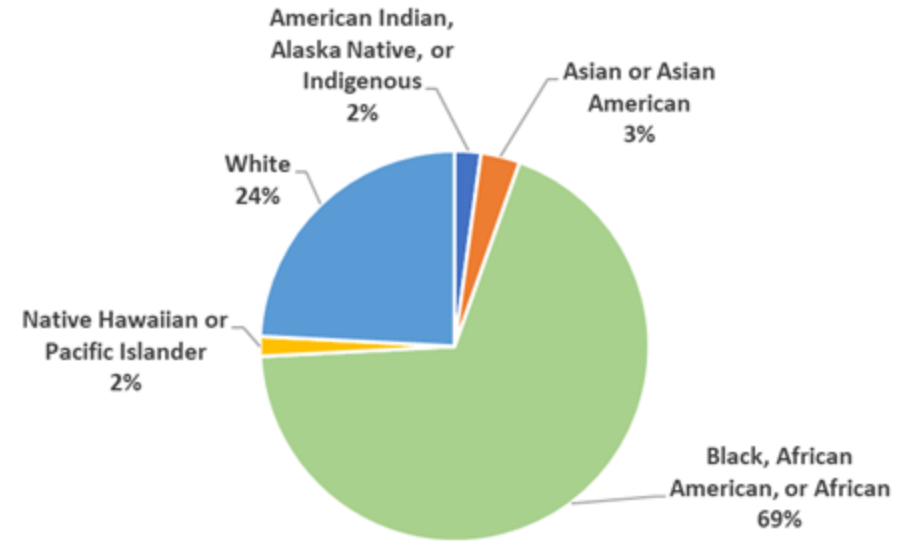

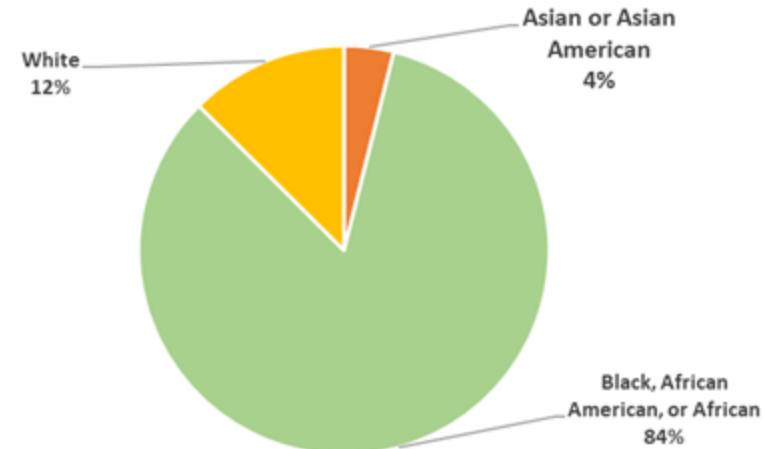

Households with minor children





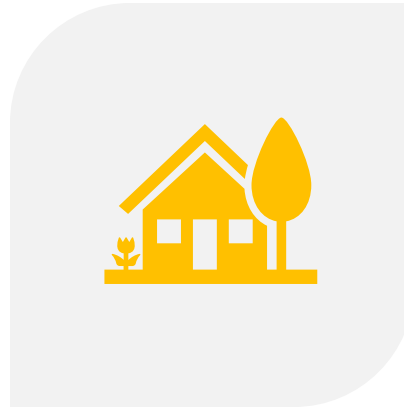
