**Background**: Montgomery County Code, 2004, Section 48-8A(b)(2)(A), provides that the County Executive must establish by executive regulation the estimated amount of solid waste generated per dwelling unit and that the regulation may consider the size of the dwelling unit.

Section 1. Estimate of solid waste generation for calculation of the residential systems benefit charges. To calculate the residential systems benefit charges each single-family dwelling unit, and each multi-family dwelling in a building consisting of six or fewer dwelling units in the County is estimated to produce 1.9182 tons per year of solid waste. Each dwelling unit in a building with seven or more dwelling units is estimated to produce .7978 tons per year of solid waste.

Section 1. <u>Estimate of solid waste generation for calculation of the residential systems benefit charges</u>. To calculate the residential systems benefit charges each single-family dwelling unit, and each multi-family dwelling in a building consisting of six or fewer dwelling units in the County is estimated to produce [1.8616] <u>1.9182</u> tons per year of solid waste. Each dwelling unit in a building with seven or more dwelling units is estimated to produce [.7484] <u>.7978</u> tons per year of solid waste.
