## <u>LITERARY CONTEST</u> (Students should work with their teachers on submission criteria)

- Students are encouraged to submit (email) electronic literary entries to human-rights.commission@montgomerycountymd.gov
  - o Essays must be 150 words or less, in poetry or essay format.
  - On a separate cover, please list the student's name, school, grade, teacher's name and teacher's email.
- Please submit a maximum of three (entries) per school to the MLK Essay Contest C/O Montgomery County Office of Human Rights, 21 Maryland Avenue, Rockville, Maryland 20850.
- All entries must be received **NO LATER THAN FRIDAY DECEMBER 23, 2016.**
- Entries submitted by the schools will be scored by the Awards Committee at the Montgomery County Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Commemorative Committee. The top three winners from throughout the County will be invited to read their essays and receive an award from the Montgomery County Executive Isaiah Leggett as part of the county-wide celebration on Monday, January 16, 2017.

## <u>VISUAL ARTS SHOW</u> (Students should work with their teachers on submission criteria)

- Prints, posters, collages, murals, photographs and all other **two-dimensional** (no three-dimensional work) visual art forms are sought, and group projects are welcome.
- Artwork submission criteria:
  - o Artwork is matted or mounted.
  - o Artwork is *clearly* labeled with the student's name, grade level, school name, and teacher's names on the back of the work.
  - o Artwork fits on panels with a dimension of 70" (height) x 38" (width).
  - o Artwork is original. Students will act ethically, without plagiarizing, when using existing imagery to research and/or create original art. Students will cite original sources and demonstrate the appropriate use of copyrighted and public domain imagery. Students will make substantial transformations beyond simple duplication to source imagery and ideas. This transformation must surpass copying the image in another medium. The resulting artwork must alter the formal qualities of design, express a new idea, and/or alter the meaning of the source.
- All entries must be received by Mrs. Linda S. Adams, Supervisor, Pre-K-12 Fine Arts, MCPS, CESC, Room 256, 850 Hungerford Drive, Rockville, Maryland 20850 NO LATER THAN DECEMBER 23, 2016. Certificates will be awarded to student participants that meet all the submission criteria.
- Artwork that meets all the submission criteria will be exhibited on Monday, January 16, 2017, in connection with the Montgomery County Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemorative Celebration, which will begin at 3:30 p.m. at the Strathmore Music Center, 5301 Tuckerman Lane, North Bethesda, Maryland 20852.
- All visual arts entries will be displayed at the Strathmore Music Hall before and after the program. All art teachers
  and students throughout the County are encouraged to attend the program which is FREE and OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.
- Artwork will again be on display at the Montgomery County Executive Building, 101 Monroe Street, Rockville, Maryland 20850 from January 17, 2017 through the end of February in celebration of Black History Month. All MCPC artwork will be returned to schools by the second week of March. Non-MCPS schools must be picked up their artwork by March 7, 2017 from the same MCPS drop off location listed above.
