


EAST-COUNTY: GROWTH OVER TIME – POPULATION DENSITY














2006-2017 percentage change in average price per square foot of Montgomery County zip codes



Map: Increase in jobs between 2015 and 2030





DIVERSITY "DOT MAP": EVERY DOT IS A COUNTY RESIDENT








MONTGOMERY COUNTY IMMIGRANTS BY PLACE OF BIRTH



394,000 residents (or 40%) speak a language other than English at home. 138,000 residents have limited English proficiency—and 26,000 households (or 7%) are "language isolated."














AGE-FRIENDLY SURVEY: AVERAGE SENIOR QUALITY OF LIFE RATING







THE GEOGRAPHY OF POVERTY IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY







ACCESSIBILITY: JOB "OPPORTUNITY SCORE"





Head Start Eligible Students 2017-2018










LEP Program Participants

The number and percentage of students assessed as eligible for the Limited English Proficient (LEP) Program. LEP is also referred to as English as a Second Language (ESL).

LEP students have a primary or home language other than English and have been assessed as having limited or no ability to understand, speak, read, or write English. The counts are reported as of the student's last day of enrollment in the school system - either the last day in school or the date the student withdrew. The percentage is calculated by dividing the number of LEP students by the June net enrollment.
