# Montgomery Council Unanimously Approves \$4.8 Billion Total Operating Budget for FY14; All-Agencies Budget Has 4.1 Percent Increase

On May 23<sup>rd</sup>, the Montgomery County Council unanimously approved a \$4.8 billion County total operating budget for Fiscal Year 2014 (July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014). The budget, which reflects a 4.1 percent increase over the approved budget for FY 2013, "continues to invest in our economic and social infrastructure," said Council President Nancy Navarro. With this new budget, schools, Montgomery College, public safety and the social "safety net" are priorities, property taxes are maintained at the charter limit, and there will be a \$692 tax credit for homeowners. In addition, library funding is increased, police staffing is increased, and the energy tax is reduced by another 10%.

The FY14 operating budget and adjustments to the Fiscal Years 2013-18 six-year Capital Improvements Program will go into effect on July 1.

## **Notice of Public Hearings re ICC Commuter Bus**

The Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) gives notice of 3 public hearings on proposed changes to the ICC commuter bus routes. The MTA is proposing to reallocate resources from three of the routes to other transit bus service due to low ridership. The affected commuter bus routes are: Nos. 202, 203, and 205. Route No. 202 operates weekday peak service between Gaithersburg and DOD/Fort Meade. Route No. 203 operates weekday peak service between Columbia and Bethesda. Route No. 205 operates weekday peak service between College Park and Germantown. The proposed date to discontinue service is August 1, 2013.
