Educating Students, Families, and the Community regarding the Opioid/Prescription Drug Overdose Epidemic

The Maryland state health department reported a 62 percent increase in overdose deaths in 2016 compared to the previous year. This is the sixth straight year that the figure has risen. In 2016, fatal and non-fatal overdoses significantly increased in Montgomery County. In response to the rising numbers of drug overdoses in Montgomery County, government agencies and the Montgomery County Bar Association have created an outreach program to educate and increase awareness.
