Dear Council President Albornoz and Councilmembers,

The Greater Bethesda Chamber of Commerce would like to express its strong support for the \$15 million supplemental funding request in support of the Institute for Health Computing partnership between the County, Universities of Maryland, College Park and Baltimore and University of Maryland Medical System (“Universities”).

This critical funding is a down payment on what will become a global center of excellence in computationally enabled life sciences research. Bringing the Universities’ world-class researchers to North Bethesda to grow this institute will provide a much-needed catalyst to spur further economic growth in the Pike District and greater North Bethesda, helping the County to achieve the potential envisioned by the award-winning 2010 White Flint Sector Plan.
