Amendments to 10B Bill 28-22 (Effective July 3, 2023)

Bill 28-22 changes Chapter 10B by:

- Clarifying that the board member training offered by the CCOC may be provided virtually;
- Requiring community association board members to undergo training every three years;
- Extending to all parties the right to request relief from the automatic stay that is triggered when a party files a complaint with the CCOC;
- Requiring staff to provide written notification of the Commission's decision to deny jurisdiction of a complaint, along with the reasons for the denial within 10 business days after the decision;
- Providing that the Commission's decision to deny jurisdiction of a complaint is not subject to judicial review, thereby preventing a party from challenging the denial of jurisdiction in court;
- Making failure to adhere to the terms of a mediated agreement a code violation;
- Increasing community association board members' terms of office from two to three years, unless the association documents provide for a different term;
- Waiving the 30-day notice requirement for any budget amendment that increases or decreases the budget by 15% if the expenditure is required to properly fund the most recent reserve study; and
- Increasing transparency in the voting procedures for board members.
