In 2022-2023 **MCDOT** Division of Traffic Engineering and Operations continued its commitment to educating the public about **Pedestrian, Bicycle & Driver Safety**.

The Program promoted safe roadway behavior by engaging with the community at outreach events, developing creative education campaigns, providing safety tips, educational materials and other resources. The program supported the **Safe Routes to School** initiative to encourage more students to walk and bike to and from school. Both programs incorporate a variety of methods and strategies to promote pedestrian, bicycle, and traffic safety education to residents of Montgomery County.

YOUTH OUTREACH

MCDOT engaged school-age residents to help them understand the importance of traffic safety. MCDOT connected with students through in-person and virtual events and programs, online contests and content.

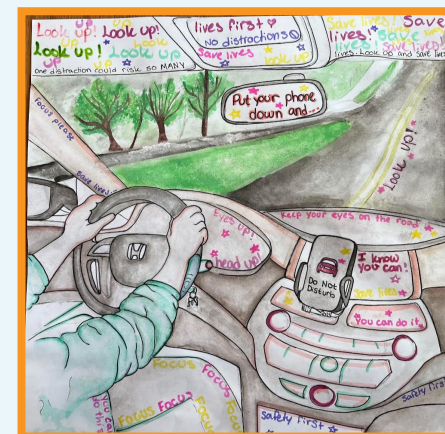

HEADS UP PHONES DOWN MCDOT

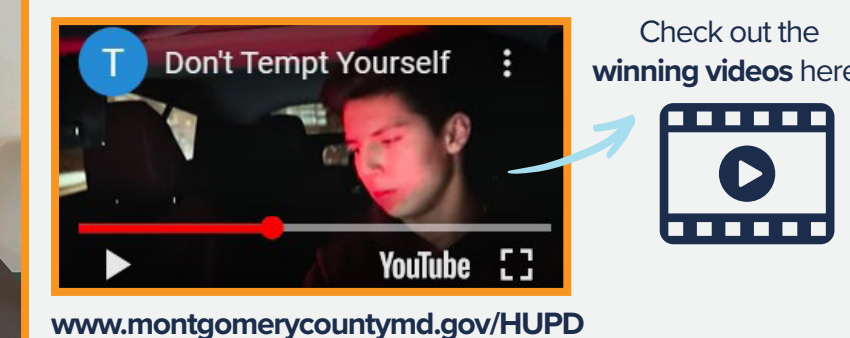

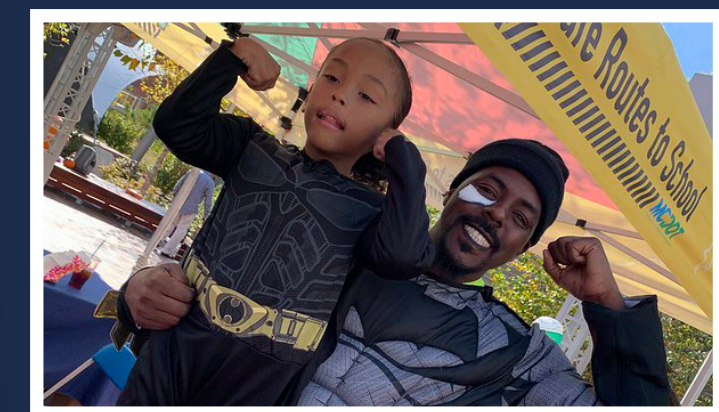
