In 2022-2023 MCDOT Division of Traffic Engineering and Operations continued its commitment to educating the public about Pedestrian, Bicycle & Driver Safety.

The Program promoted safe roadway behavior by engaging with the community at outreach events, developing creative education campaigns, providing safety tips, educational materials and other resources. The program supported the Safe Routes to School initiative to encourage more students to walk and bike to and from school. Both programs incorporate a variety of methods and strategies to promote pedestrian, bicycle, and traffic safety education to residents of Montgomery County.


