Ride On Buses Will Have Free Fares in Support of Earth Day on Tuesday, April 22



The Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) will offer free rides on County buses including Ride On, Ride On ext*R*a, Ride On Flex and Ride On Flash on Tuesday, April 22 in support of Earth Day. Ride On buses will waive the \$1 fare to encourage use of public transportation. Regular fares will be required on Metrobus. Riders who want to try Ride On Flex can download the Ride On Flex app for free from the Apple or Google store or contact the call center at 240-301-3842. Ride On offers a free trip planning app, Ride On Trip Planner, that provides transportation planning across multiple modes regionally, including Metro and Bikeshare, and gives estimated travel times and costs.

The international theme for Earth Month and Earth Day on April 22 is "Our Power, Our Planet." The theme invites everyone around the globe to unite behind renewable energy and to triple the global generation of clean electricity by 2030. There is no better time to try out environmentally friendly forms of transportation. While all bus service saves emissions over independent car travel, MCDOT is committed to a zero-emission bus fleet and has released a Zero Emission Bus

(ZEB) Transition Plan in collaboration with the County Department of General Services (DGS) to convert the County's transit fleet of nearly 400 Ride On buses by 2035. The department has 14 electric buses in operation currently and has a contract for the purchase of 100 additional electric vehicles.

The ZEB plan is purposely flexible to accommodate for emerging technology and relies heavily on State and Federal grants that MCDOT has so far been successful in receiving. The County has secured a contract to purchase additional battery electric buses, however, the range limitations of current battery electric vehicles present a challenge for current longer-range bus routes. Alternative technology is being sought to compensate for these longer-range needs. In October 2022, the County unveiled what at the time was the nation's largest solar-powered microgrid for charging of public buses at the Brookville bus depot in Silver Spring. The Brookville microgrid can charge up to 70 battery electric buses with solar power. In 2023, MCDOT secured a federal grant for its first 13 hydrogen buses and a clean hydrogen fueling station at the Gaithersburg bus depot. DGS is leading the implementation of the even larger microgrid that broke ground in June 2024 at the Gaithersburg bus depot to power the hydrogen bus project and provide additional charging infrastructure for electric buses.

The Gaithersburg depot Equipment Maintenance and Transit Operation Center (EMTOC) microgrid project will be the largest renewable energy-powered zero-emission bus depot in the nation, the first on the East Coast to produce green hydrogen on-site, and the sixth microgrid for the County. EMTOC will set a new standard for resilient, sustainable public transit, advancing the County's ambitious climate goal of reaching 100 percent reduction in carbon emissions by 2035. This 5.5-megawatt microgrid project, delivered for zero upfront costs via Energy as a Service (EaaS), will feature solar arrays, electric bus chargers and battery energy storage, enabling the depot to operate indefinitely in "island mode." It will also include a 1-megawatt hydrogen electrolyzer that will be powered by on site renewable energy. The EMTOC depot will eventually power 200 zero emissions buses. It is currently the County Department of Transportation's largest fuel user. For more information and to view the Zero Emissions Bus Transition Plan, visit the website.

On Thursday, May 15, the streets and trails of our region will come alive with the energy of cyclists from all backgrounds as we celebrate Bike to Work Day 2025. This regional event is more than just a ride, it's a movement. Hosted by the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments' Commuter Connections program and the Washington Area Bicyclist Association (WABA), Bike to Work Day is an annual tradition that promotes healthier commuting, supports clean transportation, and builds a stronger sense of community across the DMV.

Whether you're a seasoned cyclist or just considering biking to work for the first time, Bike to Work Day is the perfect opportunity to give it a try. Thousands of participants are expected to hit the trails and roads this year, enjoying the fresh air, exercise, and camaraderie that comes with riding alongside others who are passionate about creating a more sustainable future.

As part of this celebration, more than 100 pit stops will be set up across the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia. These pit stops are fun, welcoming places where riders can take a break, grab some refreshments, and connect with local organizations that support cycling and sustainable transportation. Registered riders can also receive a free commemorative Bike to Work Day t-shirt (available to the first 18,000 registrants), along with giveaways and entries into regional raffles, including a chance to win a brand-new bicycle and other exciting prizes.

Celebrating the Heartbeat of Our Communities: National Transportation Week 2025





Seniors (65+) ride free within Montgomery County on all Ride On buses and most Metrobuses. In the region, seniors receive a 50% discount on fares for Metrorail, Metrobus and regional buses that accept SmarTrip. A government issued photo ID with proof of age is required to obtain the SmarTrip card.

Below are some frequently asked questions about the Senior SmarTrip card:

1. Where can I add stored value and passes to my Senior SmarTrip card? Metrorail fare vending machine, online using your SmarTrip account or the SmarTrip Mobile App, or by visiting a sales location at select retail stores, like CVS Pharmacy, Giant Food and Commuter Stores.

2. Can I get a virtual Senior SmarTrip card on my mobile phone?

Yes. After you obtain a plastic Senior SmarTrip card, you can transfer it to your mobile phone's Apple Wallet or Google Pay by following the Mobile Pay instructions.

3. How do I replace a lost or damaged Senior SmarTrip card?

If you need a replacement card immediately, then you can get one at any of the in person locations.

- 4. I obtained a Senior SmarTrip card prior to the \$2.00 card fee waiver that started on January 16, 2024. Will my \$2.00 card fee be reimbursed?

 No.
- 5. Can I get another Senior SmarTrip card if I already have one?

No. Each eligible customers (65 and older) can only have one active Senior SmarTrip card at a time.

Senior SmarTrip cards are available at all County libraries, TRiPS stores, and the County Treasury office in Rockville. Please bring a proof of age. Get yours and ride free on all Ride On buses and most Metrobuses in the County.

- Baby food and formula


Please avoid donating items in glass containers or those that are expired or opened.

Building a Better Ride On: Ride On Reimagined Study Year 1 Implementation Begins June 29th



The Ride On Reimagined Service and Implementation Plan is set to transform public transportation in Montgomery County by making it more efficient, accessible, and aligned with the needs of the community. The implementation of the Ride On Reimagined Service and Implementation Plan will take place in phases beginning with the launch of the Year 1 Network on June 29, 2025, which will introduce route enhancements and service adjustments. The Year 1 network allows for immediate changes already allocated for in the county's budget and doesn't require any additional funding. These improvements will be achieved by optimizing existing routes, better integration with Metrobus, and allocating resources to high demand areas.

The Year 1 Network consists of several key elements including:

- Route 10: This route will be discontinued and replaced by new Metrobus routes M12, M42, M44, and M60 as part of WMATA's Better Bus network redesign.
- Route 34: This route will continue to provide service between Bethesda,
 Medical Center, and Wheaton Metro Stations. The current routing between
 Wheaton and Bethesda will remain the same. Ride On 41 will provide
 service between Aspen Hill and Wheaton. Metrobus D96 will service
 between Bethesda and Friendship Heights Metro Stations. Route 34 will
 also be streamlined to remain on Connecticut Avenue between Veirs Mill
 Road and University Boulevard as a replacement for the Metrobus Route L8
 along this corridor.

- Route 40: In anticipation of the Veirs Mill Road BRT, Ride On will introduce
 the new Route 40, previously referred to as the M10 in WMATA's Bus
 Network Redesign materials. Route 40 will replace WMATA's discontinued
 Q2, Q4, and Q6 routes, operating between Wheaton and Montgomery
 College Rockville.
- Route 41: Ride On Route 41 will be extended south to Wheaton to replace Route 34 and L8 service on parts of Connecticut Avenue. Service will be provided between Glenmont and Wheaton Station via Weller Road, Connecticut Avenue, Plyers Mill Road, and Georgia Avenue.
- Route 42: This route will run between North Bethesda Station and Montgomery Mall Transit Center; service to Boiling Brook Parkway & Bolger Center will be discontinued. Ride On 38 will provide service on Boiling Brook Pkwy. Metrobus M42 & M44 will stop at Parklawn Drive and Parklawn Drive and end at North Bethesda Station. The existing Metrobus Route T2 will be replaced with the Metrobus Route M82 in WMATA's Year 1 network.

As Ride On celebrates 50 years of service, Ride On Reimagined reflects a renewed commitment to serving Montgomery County. This is the first step of the Ride On Reimagined Service and Implementation Plan and will deliver tangible benefits for the thousands of Montgomery County riders who rely on Ride On, such as more reliable service, shorter wait times, stronger connections with Metrobus, and providing more value without increasing costs for our riders. Montgomery County residents are encouraged to review the final report to understand the upcoming improvements and how they can benefit from the redesigned network. Metro Lift Program Offers Options For Low Income Riders



Metro offers reduced fares to assist low-income customers. The income-qualified reduced fare program, 'Metro Lift', launched in 2023. Customers who qualify for the

US Department of Agriculture's Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) are eligible to enroll.

Approved by Metro's Board of Directors in the fiscal year 2024 budget, the program advances transit equity and affordability in a region considered one of the most expensive in the nation and where low-income households face the greatest economic disparities. Customers enrolled in Metro Lift receive a 50 percent discount for any travel on Metrorail and Metrobus.

It is free to enroll in Metro Lift. Customers who qualify for Metro Lift must show that they are current recipients of SNAP benefits. The fare discount will be valid for one year after enrollment and will be available up to 48 hours after online enrollment, and immediately for those that enroll in person.

Ride On and Metro Service Changes Coming in June

The Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) is adjusting six Ride On bus routes on Sunday, June 29, to implement Year 1 of the Ride On Reimagined Study and ensure uninterrupted service amidst Metro's Better Bus Network changes. Routes 10, 29, 34, 41, 42, and 43 will be impacted, and a new Route 40 will be added. Stay tuned to RideOnBus.com or subscribe to our email alerts by visiting www.montgomerycountymd.gov/govdelivery. Plan Your Next Trip with the Ride On Trip Planner

Have you downloaded the Ride On Trip Planner App yet? This new, innovative app allows riders to plan their next trip and to tell how crowded a Ride On bus is – before it arrives – with the crowdedness indicator on the app. Riders can choose if they want to get on the arriving bus, wait for the next bus depending on how many people are on the bus, or choose another travel option, such as other local transit services, bikeshare, and scooter. It gives riders more control over their transportation experience.
