CANVASSING

Overview of Canvass Process

Sara Harris explained the rules concerning public observation of the canvass, provided an overview of the canvassing process and noted that the rules were posted in the canvass room. Ballots were distributed to the ballot processing teams in batches. Each team reviewed the envelope first to determine whether it was timely received.

For timely received ballots, each team determined whether the voter signed the oath. After verifying that the oath was signed, each team opened the envelopes. With the envelope face down, each team removed the ballot, ensuring that the envelope stayed face down. After removing all of the ballots in the batch, the ballot envelopes were set aside. Each team reviewed the ballots for compliance and tabulating acceptability. Those timely ballots that were in compliance and could be read by the voting unit were referred to the Board of Canvassers for acceptance.

Canvassing of Absentee Ballots

In order to preserve the secrecy of the ballot for the remaining canvasses, five ballots of each ballot style were held back for the provisional canvass, and five ballots of each ballot style were held back for the second absentee canvass.

Printing Canvass Results

After scanning all accepted absentee ballots, staff locked the voting unit(s) and printed an Election Results Report. The Board of Canvassers confirmed that the number of accepted ballots equaled the number of ballots counted by the optical scan voting unit(s). The Board of Canvassers signed the Election Results Report and posted a second copy of the report outside the canvass room.
