DECLARATION OF QUORUM PRESENT

The meeting of the Board of Canvassers began at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, November 10, 2010 at the Board of Elections, 18753 North Frederick Avenue, Suite 210, Gaithersburg, Maryland 20879-3124. There was a quorum of the Board of Canvassers, and at least one member of the Board of Canvassers who is a registered voter of the principal minority party was present.

CONFIRMATION OF OATH

Prior to the commencement of the canvass, Loretta E. Knight, the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Montgomery County, administered and recorded the oath of each member of the Board of Canvassers. Substitute members of the Board of Elections and the Board Attorney were also sworn-in on the same day.

ELECTION/ANNOUNCEMENT OF OFFICERS

The Board of Canvassers elected Jerrold S. Garson as Chairman of the Board of Canvassers and Nancy H. Dacek as Secretary. The motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF CANVASS

Public notice of the provisional canvass was provided by a media release, it was posted on the Montgomery County Board of Elections' website and was mailed to candidates.

CANVASSING

Overview of Canvass Process

Sara Harris explained the rules concerning public observation of the canvass and provided an overview of the canvassing process. Sara Harris explained that each provisional ballot application was reviewed prior to it being canvassed to determine the voter's eligibility to vote in this election. At this canvass, the provisional ballot applications will be presented to the Board of Canvassers with a recommendation. The recommendations were:

- Accept provisional ballot application in full recommend counting all votes cast on the provisional ballot.
- Accept provisional ballot application in part recommend counting some but not all votes cast on the provisional ballot. This was done because the voter voted an incorrect ballot style.

 Reject provisional ballot application – recommend not counting the provisional ballot.

The Board of Canvassers voted to accept in full, accept in part, or reject the provisional ballots. The provisional ballots for which the Board voted to accept in full or accept in part were distributed to the bi-partisan ballot processing teams to open and review the ballots. The "accepted in full" ballots were scanned into the voting unit, and the "accepted in part" ballots were referred to a duplicating team. The duplicating team copied onto the voter's correct ballot style the votes for the contests for which the provisional voter is eligible to vote.

Sara Harris explained the process to provide information to the Board of Canvassers or challenge a decision of the Board.

Canvassing of Provisional Ballots

6,887 provisional ballots were cast.

Public Observers

There were no public observers.

Results:

- There were 5,163 provisional ballots with a recommendation to accept in full. The
 recommendation was based on the fact that staff had confirmed that each provisional
 application was submitted by a registered voter and was otherwise eligible to vote. The
 Board unanimously voted to accept the recommendation and accept and count the
 provisional ballots in full.
- There were 1,160 provisional ballots with a recommendation to accept in part. The recommendation was based on the fact that staff had confirmed that each provisional application was submitted by a registered voter but it was not the correct provisional ballot.
- There were 502 provisional ballots with a recommendation to reject because staff could
 not confirm that the applicant was a registered voter. The Board unanimously voted to
 accept the recommendation and reject the ballot(s).
- 4. There were 15 provisional ballots with a recommendation to reject because the applicant returned a voted absentee ballot or already voted. The Board unanimously voted to accept the recommendation and reject the ballot(s).
- There were 33 provisional ballots with a recommendation to reject because the voter failed to sign the provisional ballot application. The Board unanimously voted to accept the recommendation and reject the ballot(s).
- There were 7 provisional ballots with a recommendation to reject because the applicant
 was not eligible to receive a provisional ballot. The Board unanimously voted to accept
 the recommendation and reject the ballot(s).
- 7. There were 5 provisional ballots with a recommendation to reject because the applicant did not provide identification or personal identification information in time. The Board unanimously voted to accept the recommendation and reject the ballot(s).

- 8. There were 5 provisional ballots with a recommendation to reject because the applicant provided his or her driver's license or social security number but the number was not verified. The Board unanimously voted to accept the recommendation and reject the ballot(s).
- 9. There was 1 provisional ballot with a recommendation to reject because the applicant provided identification but the identification provided did not satisfy the requirements. The Board unanimously voted to accept the recommendation and reject the ballot(s).

Printing Canvass Results

After scanning all accepted in full and accepted in part provisional ballots, staff locked the voting unit and printed an Election Results Report. The Board of Canvassers confirmed that the number of accepted in full and accepted in part ballots equaled the number of ballots counted by the optical scan voting unit(s). The Board of Canvassers signed the Election Results Report and posted a second copy of the report.
