CANVASSING

Overview of Canvass Process

James Shalleck, President of the Board of Elections and Chair of the Board of Canvassers, provided an introduction to the canvass teams. Ms. Jurgensen thereafter explained the rules concerning public observation of the canvass, provided an overview of the canvassing process and noted that the rules were posted in the canvass room.

The Board of Elections received 2,761 that needed to be duplicated. The teams inspected the ballots to determine that they needed to be duplicated. The canvass team was provided the correct ballot style. One team member read the voter's choices for the races he or she was eligible to vote in. The other canvass team duplicated the ballot. The team member who duplicated the ballot then read aloud the voter's choices, while the other canvass member verified the accuracy of the duplication.

The remaining canvass teams processed ballots that did not need to be duplicated. Each team reviewed the envelope first to determine whether it was timely received. For timely received ballots, each team determined whether the voter signed the oath. After verifying that the oath was signed, each team opened the envelopes. With the envelope face down, each team removed the ballot, taking care that the envelope stayed face down. After removing all of the ballots in the batch, the ballot envelopes were set aside. Each team reviewed the ballots for compliance and tabulating acceptability. Those timely ballots that were in compliance and could be read by the ballot scanner are referred for tabulation.

Printing Canvass Results

After scanning all accepted absentee ballots, staff locked the ballot scanners and printed an Election Results Report. The Board of Canvassers confirmed the number of ballots counted by the ballot scanners. The Board of Canvassers signed the Voting Results Report and posted a second copy of the report outside the canvass room.
