Early Voting is July 7, 2022 through July 14, 2022

Important Information regarding Early Voting! Early Voting service assignments are available via your EJ Connection account. Please review your assignment and confirm your assignment. The Pre-Early Voting Set-up Meeting will be held on July 6, 2022, at 6:30 pm. You are required to attend this meeting if you are assigned to work on July 7th and if you are serving as an Early Voting Chief (EVCHF) at any time during Early Voting. We still have several vacancies for Early Voting Sites in Potomac, Sandy Spring, and Rockville. These locations are our priority to fill.

Important Information regarding Election Day! Election Day assignments are available now via your EJ Connection account. Please review your assignment and confirm your assignment. Election Day is July 19^{th,} and the pre-election set-up meeting is the evening of July 18, 2022 at 6:30pm. This meeting is mandatory, and all election workers assigned to a polling precinct are required to attend.

I'm working on Election Day when do I vote? Election Workers are asked to vote either by Mail-in ballot or during the Early Voting period at a time when you are not assigned to serve. There is still time to request a mail-in ballot for the Primary election. Your voted ballot may be returned to the Board of Elections, mailed with a postmark by the Postal Service dated by Election Day or dropped in one of the designated Drop-Boxes by 8:00 pm on Election Day. Full day Election Workers who are **not** assigned to work in their voting precinct on Election Day who have not voted and still wish to vote <u>must</u> vote a provisional ballot in their work precinct, since they will be unable to leave and go to their voting precinct. - ➤ Voter Operations-Part -Day (VOP-A) 6:00AM to about 3:00PM
- Voter Operations-Part -Day (VOP-B) 2:00PM to about 11:00PM
- Same Day Registration (SDR) 6:00AM to about 11:00PM
- ➤ Voter Operations Provisional (VOP-P) 6:00AM to about 11:00PM
- Closer (CLS) 6:30PM to about 11:30PM

Are you interested in a leadership role as Chief Judge or Roamer on Election Day? If you have good organizational and communication skills and an interest in either of these positions, notify your Recruiter. To be a Chief, it is recommended that you have prior experience as a VOP judge and to be a Roamer prior experience as a Chief is required. See position descriptions at www.777vote.org

Bilingual Election Workers are needed

Due to the requirements of Section 203 of the 1975 Voting Rights Act, workers with Spanish speaking fluency are needed in every precinct. We are also looking for workers that speak Chinese, French, Korean and Vietnamese. Please list all languages that you speak fluently on your application.

^{*}If you have a "C" behind your position, this is an indication that your work precinct is a consolidated voting precinct. Which means that more than one precinct at the polling location. Example VOP-C or CHF-C

July In-Person Training Training for the upcoming Primary election is coming to an end. The schedule is open now via your EJ Connection account. If you have been emailed your position by a recruiter and there are no class showing in your calendar, then classes are full. Depending on trainer and location availability, there may be more classes added between now and just before Election Day. It is recommended that you check your account daily for added classes. If you are unable to attend a training class, there are positions that do not require in-person training.

The Election Worker Program is responsible for staffing a variety of positions with volunteers to serve during Early Voting and Election Day. Most of the positions are in a polling precinct however, we have other positions that are not.

Please know that your recruiters will assign you to a position and location that meets the needs of the Board of Elections.

Every role is important and vital to the success of our Elections.

Positions that DO require in-person training:

- ➤ Chief Election Judge (CHF) (*MUST BE 18 y/o or older)* work from 6:00am to about 11:00pm and requires a car and cell phone
- Same Day Registration (SDR) (MUST BE 18 y/o or older)- work from 6:00am to about 11:00pm
- Closing (CLS) judges (MUST BE 18 y/o or older)- work from 6:30pm to about 11:30pm and requires a car and cell phone
- Regional site Technicians (RST)- work at one of the 7 Regional Upload Sites throughout the county from 7:30pm-10:30pm and requires a cell phone

Positions that do not require In-Person training

- Election Day Runner (RNR) MUST BE 17 y/o or older- requires a car and a cell phone and works at the Board of Elections (BOE) from either 5am to noon (RNR-A) or Noon to 7pm (RNR-B) You would be driving throughout the county to multiple polling placing as needed.
- Election Night Support (ENS)- works at the Board of Elections (BOE) from 7:30pm to 12:30am. Must be able to provide support in several election night task such as warehouse assistant, traffic control, pollbook retrieval and should be able to lift up to 50lbs.

For Election Day Chief Judges ONLY

Chief Judge Supply Pick-up (ID required for pick-up) Saturday, July 16 – This is mandatory. The supply pick-up is done by either you or your Co-Chief and must be completed between 7:00 am and 2:00 pm at the Board of Elections. Please make sure to coordinate the pick-up with your Co-Chief prior to July 11th. You will receive a Supply Pick-Up Card via USPS next week. The card must be displayed in your front window, with the precinct number facing out.

Chief Judge Briefing Sign-up – Chief briefings will be held Friday, July 15th and Saturday, July 16th. One Chief from each precinct is required to attend. The sign-up information and times for the Chief Judge briefing will be sent out by early next week. The location of the Chief briefing is Watkins Mill High School in Gaithersburg, MD.

If you schedule your Chief Briefing the same day as bag pick-up, pick up your supply bag first.

Monday Night Meeting Monday, July 18th - should begin at 6:30PM and last no more than 2-hours. If you need to deviate from the standard meeting start time, email your recruiter. Be sure to include the work precinct in the email. Call the help desk when your precinct is set up and ready to go.

Precinct Rosters- Please contact all members of your team by Thursday, July 14th to introduce yourself as Chiefs, confirm the Monday Night Meeting time with the team – only one chief has to contact people, or you may split up the list. Everyone must be contacted by at least one of you.

Check and recheck your rosters – Most precincts will have changes to their list. We will be assigning election workers daily including Election Day. If a judge no longer appears on your list (that was there weeks ago), do not contact them. They have withdrawn or moved and are no longer serving in your precinct. I recommend checking your roster daily for changes from this point forward.

- 3. To qualify to win, both "Pals" listed on the entry ticket must serve as Election Workers for the Gubernatorial Primary Election on July 19, 2022 or the General Election on November 8, 2022. The "Pal" who is referred must be new to the Election Worker Program and has never served as an Election Worker. Both "Pals" must be in good standing with the Election Worker Program.
