Providers of services to people who have a developmental disability and that receive funding from the Maryland Developmental Disability Administration (DDA) are licensed or certified by DDA and approved by the Maryland Department of Health (MDH): <u>https://health.maryland.gov/dda/Pages/CSW\_Providers.aspx</u>

DDA/MDH are responsible for oversight and policy direction for these providers. The Office of Health Care Quality (OHCQ) is the agency within the MDH charged with monitoring the quality of care in Maryland's health care facilities and community-based programs. MDH licenses and regulates the OHCQ and pays (with Medicaid) for DDA approved providers including Adult Medical Day Care. Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA)

DDA's Regional Offices are available to assist individuals, families, providers, and Marylanders in need in the event of an emergent situation including after normal business hours. **Please note** that for medical or safety emergencies that require police or medical response, contact 911.

**Mobile Crisis Intervention Service (MCIS)** is a group of behavioral health teams across the state. They can respond in-person as needed during a crisis. Anyone in Maryland can use this service including people who get DDA services. Starting July 1, 2023, anyone in a crisis (which includes stress, emotional or behavioral needs, problems with substance abuse like drugs or alcohol, or things that can make it hard to do things at home, work or in the community) should call 988 to get mobile crisis services. One of the state's eight call centers will answer the call. These centers provide support over the phone and will also give information about local resources. You can also text 988.

Through the Autism Waiver Program, students and families receive respite care, environmental accessibility adaptations, family training, supported adult life planning, and intensive individual support services in the home and community, therapeutic integration service, service coordination and, in some cases, residential habilitation.
- **My Turn Program** provides support and assistance to families with children ages three to thirteen who have developmental disabilities and are not connected with State of Maryland resources. Services include outreach, assistance with summer camp placements and other programmatic and financial assistance.
- Targeted Case Management/Coordination of Care Services (formerly Resource Coordination) Assists individuals with developmental disabilities who receive funding from the DDA in obtaining the best quality and most appropriate services and supports with available resources within the community. Resource Coordinators provide case management and advocate for individuals receiving services.
- **Respite Services** provides short-term temporary relief to unpaid live-in caregivers/families who are providing full-time care to children with severe medical conditions, children/adults with disabilities, or frail seniors. Care is provided by trained, certified care workers in the family's home or in a respite care facility.
