Montgomery County residents providing unpaid, live-in, primary care for a frail senior citizen may apply for respite care. The Arc Montgomery County can make arrangements for a few hours, a day, a weekend, or perhaps longer at a family-selected venue, e.g., family home, adult medical day program or approved respite facility. Professional staff help residents identify transportation services appropriate to their situation (e.g., Metro Access, Call N Ride taxi service or perhaps escorted transportation). For callers interested in mobility options beyond driving, staff describe free Ride Smart travel training workshops and free Still Driving? Support Groups.

Support groups in Silver Spring and Gaithersburg offer spouses and adult children a venue to share sorrows. successes, resources and solutions. Classes address handling a parent's finances, first aid and CPR. The library provides access to books, DVDs, audiotapes and videotapes on caregiver issues and health-related topics, and listings of aging adult services in our community. The newsletter, published thrice annually, provides tips, book reviews, resources and articles on caregiving.
