# CAB Advocacy Accomplishments in FY24 July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024

#### **Head Start**

- Dr. Johnson sent a letter to DHHS Director Dr. James Bridgers on behalf of the CAB requesting that he assist the agency in obtaining required information from MCPS to comply with the requirements of the **Head Start federal monitoring visit**.
- Dr. Johnson testified on behalf of the CAB at the **Board of Education budget hearing**. The CAB's testimony focused on expanding part-day Head Start/PreK classes to full-day, the need for a mixed delivery system in implementing the Blueprint for Maryland's Future with regard to PreK, information sharing between the agency and MCPS, and added efficiency within the MCPS.

## **CAB** and MCAP Priorities

- Dr. Johnson testified at the annual County Council HHS Committee Worksession for Boards, Committees, and Commissions. The CAB's testimony focused on CAA staffing needs and returning the WFIS to a 100% match of the state EITC.
- Dr. Johnson testified at the annual Joint House and Senate Priorities Hearing. The CAB's
  testimony focused on the Community Action Anti-Poverty Fund, 2Gen/Whole Family Approach
  funding, the Maryland EITC and CTC, early childhood education, and the Self-Sufficiency
  Standard.
- Dr. Johnson participated in the MCAP Advocacy Day in Annapolis, meeting with members of the Montgomery County Delegation to advocate for MCAP's key state-level priorities. As part of the event, Board leaders and staff participated in a virtual meeting with Delegate Kaiser to discuss MCAP's state-level priorities.
- CAB submitted testimony in support of HB860 Housing and Community Development -Community Action Boards
- Dr. Johnson testified on behalf of the CAB at the County Council budget hearing for FY25. The
  board's testimony requested funding to support two broker positions the agency would lose at
  the end of the fiscal year and one that would be reduced from full-time to part-time. The
  testimony also requested full funding for the WFIS so that it would return to a 100% match of
  the state EITC. Equity between PreK and HS classes and the need for full-day classes, along with
  the ongoing issue of affordable housing were also addressed.
- CAB joined a sign-on letter developed by MCAP requesting additional funding for the CSBG budget and allowing agencies to continue to serve people at 200% of the federal poverty level.

## Food Security

- CAB submitted testimony in support of HB183/SB213 Human Services Food Supplement
   Program Human Services Careers Scholarships Alterations.
- CAB submitted testimony in support of SB579/HB696 Primary and Secondary Education -Breakfast and Lunch Programs - Universal Expansion Report.

## Tax Credits and VITA

- CAB submitted testimony in support of **HB451/SB676 Tax Assistance for Low-Income Marylanders Funding**.
- CAB submitted testimony in support of **HB608 Earned Income Tax Credit Individuals Without Qualifying Children Eligibility.**

- CAB submitted testimony in support of HB 1304 Maryland Department of Health and
   Department of Human Services Earned Income Tax Credit Distribution of Information.
- CAB led a sign-on letter requesting that the County Council add funding to the WFIS budget so
  that it would return to a 100% match of the state EITC. Twenty local, state, and federal level
  organizations joined the letter.

# Renters Rights/Affordable Housing

- CAB submitted testimony in support of SB 689/HB823 Fire Protection and Prevention Residential Rental Property Requirements (Melanie Nicholle Diaz Fire Safety Act).
- CAB submitted testimony to the County Council in support of **County Council Bill 7 24**: Landlord-Tenant Relations Tenant Protection and Notification.

## Addressing generational poverty

- CAB submitted testimony in support of SB 0482/HB694 Governor's Office for Children -Engaging Neighborhoods, Organizations, Unions, Governments, and Households Grant Program (ENOUGH Act of 2024) \*Dr. Johnson testified in person in support of the Senate bill.
- Dr. Johnson testified on behalf of the CAB at the County Council hearing for Bill 5-24 Child
   Investment Fund.

#### Health

- CAB member Lisette Orellana Engel testified on behalf of the CAB in support of County Council
  Bill 42-23: Health and Sanitation Menstrual Products in Public Restrooms Required. The bill
  would require all public restrooms to provide menstrual products. Lisette also spoke at a press
  conference for the bill.
- CAB submitted testimony in support of SB705/HB728 Health Insurance Qualified Resident Enrollment Program (Access to Care Act).
