1 Orientations: Your first step begins by completing the interactive MSDE hosted orientation on-line at <http://earlychildhood.marylandpublicschools.org/node/785>.

2 Business Plan: Setting up your business is a crucial step for future success. Important elements include developing a marketing plan, setting up your record keeping files, creating contracts, and developing a budget. Contact the Maryland Women's Business Center for counseling on getting your business started.

3 Schedule Appointments: All adults over the age of 18 living in the home must complete a criminal background check. Montgomery County Department of Police provides this service; however, you must schedule your appointment (<http://www.mymcpnews.com/resources/how-to/fingerprinting/>). In addition, everyone living in the home must complete an updated medical evaluation.

4 Training: Specific MSDE approved training must be completed in order to obtain a registration. Call us to complete **all** your required training:

- ❖ 24-Hour Pre-Service for Family Child Care
- ❖ 6-Hour Emergency Disaster Preparedness
- ❖ 6-Hour Medication Administration
- ❖ 3-Hour Including All Children and the ADA
- ❖ Sudden Infant Death Syndrome
- ❖ Supporting Breastfeeding in Child Care
- ❖ Skills-Based CPR and First Aid Certification
- ❖ *Soon you will also be required to complete On Track: All Aboard Developmental Screening Overview included in our package!*

5 Prepare Your Home: Creating a safe and nurturing environment for children to thrive takes time and planning. When setting up your child care environment consider the following:

Child proof your home:

- Use protective barriers to restrict areas
- Cover electric sockets with child-proof covers
- Place chemicals, medicines, and other harmful items out of reach
- Install hard wired (with battery back-up) smoke detectors in each room where children will sleep
- Set up a first aid kit based on OCC regulations

Create your environment:

- Provide cribs, mats/cots for each child to nap and rest on
- Offer a variety of developmentally appropriate toys, learning materials and books for all ages you plan to care for
- Create interest areas
- Set up outdoor play equipment and toys

Our staff are available to help assess your environment, review your record keeping system or provide guidance with any aspect of the registration process.

6 Inspections: Once you have set up your child care space, request an inspection on-line with the Montgomery County Fire & Rescue Service by completing the form: http://www.montgomerycountymd.gov/mcfrs-code/form_inspection_other.html. There is a fee for this inspection. The Office of Child Care will schedule a home inspection once approval from the Fire Marshal's office is obtained, training has been fulfilled, your background check has been completed, and the application is completed.

HELPFUL HINTS

- 💡 Make copies of all documents before submitting to the Office of Child Care.
- 💡 To avoid paying for multiple visits from the fire code inspector, schedule the inspection once your space is set up and ready to operate. You can review the Fire Marshal's guide and inspection requirements online: <http://www.montgomerycountymd.gov/mcfrs-code/daycare.html>
- 💡 You have one year from the date of orientation to apply. However, once you submit your application, you have six months to complete the process.



SUCCESS!

Once OCC determines you and your home meet all requirements, a certificate of registration is mailed and you can operate your family child care business!
