




ADULTS WITHOUT MINOR CHILDREN SYSTEM FLOW

Housing Stabilization Services

In FY23, 44,000 households received late rent notices from the court.

To date, \$124.6 million in emergency rental assistance distributed, preventing more than 19,100 evictions (serving 16,326 households deduplicated).

As of last week SEPH is no longer accepting CRRP applications.



Homeless Triage/Centralized Diversion

There is no homeless triage down county.

People have to call or go to 1301 Piccard Drive in Rockville.

Centralized diversion is only available from 9am to 6pm.

People circumvent engagement with diversion in the evenings, overnights and weekends, leading to larger inflow into the shelters.

Shelters generally have few beds available.


Inadequate Capacity for Families Needing RRH/PSH

There are 94 families on the Coordinated Entry list.

The system does not have enough capacity among Rapid Rehousing and Permanent Supportive Housing partners to house these families.

In addition, housing for larger families is scarce often cannot be covered by the subsidies available.



Operative Definitions for Our Work

- Race A social construct used to oppress and discriminate against group of people based on physical characteristics. Race is an identity that has been used to limit black and brown communities' access to freedom, education, housing, and the ability to build wealth.
- Racism racial prejudice, or unfounded beliefs and irrational fears, that is present at the individual, institutional, systemic and structural levels of communities and government.
 - Power- The ability to help or harm, whether known or unknown.
- Privilege unearned power, benefits, advantages, access and/or opportunities. It
 operates on personal, interpersonal, cultural, and institutional levels. Power and
 privilege are often implicit and distributed unevenly.



Equity Design

 This is the process to dismantle systems of oppression and (re)design them towards liberation and healing by centering the power of communities historically impacted by the oppressive systems being (re)designed.

Equity Design ensures that those impacted by a decision / policy are part of /
consulted in the decision-making process throughout from conceptualization
to monitoring of the final product. The participation of these individuals should not
be tokenized.

Questions To Ensure We Are Inviting Diverse Co-Creators To Our Work

- 1. Are we bringing together people with different perspectives, values, experiences and expertise to the decision-making table?
- 2. Have the community members most impacted not only been invited to but consistently included and heard at each stage of the decision-making process?
- 3. Do these individuals have the resources necessary to participate meaningfully and contribute to the conversation?

Questions About Equitable Ideation and Collaboration

- Are the impacted populations voice / lived experiences reflected, elevated or even amplified in in the final product?
- Using the framework of public participation, have we moved to empower those most impacted / those with lived experiences? As evidenced by:
 - Affording these individuals with final decision-making power; and
 - Deference to them on what should be implemented and how it should be implemented.
