





The Purple Line is a 16.2-mile light rail transit line with 21 stations that will extend from Bethesda in Montgomery County to New Carrollton in Prince George's County. It will provide a direct connection to the Metrorail Red Line at Bethesda and Silver Spring; Green Line at College Park; and the Orange Line at New Carrollton; as well as all three of the MARC rail lines and Amtrack's Northeast Corridor at New Carrollton.
