Expedited Bill 27-23, Police – Policing Advisory Commission - Repeal

COUNCIL DECISION POINTS & COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

- Motion followed by hand vote, under Council Rule 6(g), on whether to withdraw Expedited Bill 27-23.
- A motion may be made by an original sponsor of the bill to withdraw the bill.
- A majority vote is required to withdraw the bill.

DESCRIPTION/ISSUE

The lead sponsor of Expedited Bill 27-23, Councilmember Luedtke, requests the withdrawal of the bill, and wishes instead to introduce a new bill amending the provisions governing the Policing Advisory Commission (PAC). Expedited Bill 27-23 as introduced would have repealed the PAC. Bill sponsors had proposed amendments to the bill but instead of pursuing those as amendments to Expedited Bill 27-23, Councilmember Luedtke is incorporating them into a new bill scheduled for introduction on July 25, 2023.

SUMMARY OF KEY DISCUSSION POINTS

- Expedited Bill 27-23 was introduced on May 25, 2023.
- A public hearing was held on June 13, 2023.
- A worksession of the Public Safety Committee was held on June 26, 2023, and the Committee supported the bill sponsors' proposal to withdraw the bill.
- The lead sponsor is introducing a new bill amending the provisions governing the PAC and wishes to withdraw the bill.
