




SELF-REPORTED CHARACTERISTICS

- 50% OF TENANT APPLICANTS MATCHED WITH LANDLORD APPLICATION
- **53**% UNEMPLOYED PAST 90 DAYS
- 27% NEEDED TO CARE FOR SELF/OTHERS
- **25**% RECEIVED EVICTION NOTICE (SELF-REPORTED)











SHELTER RESIDENTS: AVERAGE DAILY COUNT BY WEEK





MC311 WEEKLY CALL VOLUME







- Montgomery County continues to rank #1 nationwide for % of 12+ population fully vaccinated among all US counties with >300K residents
- The county ranks 7th among all US counties with >300K residents for % of 5+ population <u>fully</u> vaccinated
- Nearly 300,000 Montgomery County residents have received an additional dose (36% of 16+ population)*
- * Count from Maryland Department of Health, 12.21.21. Population 16+ represents the age group eligible for boosters. Population estimate generated from IPUMS ACS 2019.



The percentages of 12-17 year olds and 5-11 year olds vaccinated are reported as 90% confidence range because of higher margin of errors within these age groups. According to the CDC, as of 12.21.21, 86,503 12-17 year olds received at least 1 dose, and 76,265 received a complete series. Among 5-11 year olds, 46,144 received at least one dose, and 29,129 received a complete series.


