

The proposed Shared Use Path extends along the east side of Dr. Bird Road from MD 108 to Lake Norwood Way where it will connect to an existing shared use path. The proposed path will continue along the east side of Norwood Road from the Adventure Park at Sandy Spring to Ednor Road and connect to an existing shared use path on the south side of Ednor Road.



INTRODUCTION

ne Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) is investing in a well connected pedestrian and bicycle network which enriches the livability of a community. Therefore, MCDOT is implementing bicycle facilities such as off road shared use paths, which serve as critical links in the transportation system, providing access to residential areas, transit, commercial districts, schools, places of worship, parks, and recreation areas.

MCDOT has initiated preliminary design for the Heritage Triangle Trail, Phase 1 which will create a network of shared-use paths connecting local heritage areas. Phase 1 will examine portions of the Dr. Bird / Norwood Road corridor from MD 108 to Ednor Road in order to develop plans for providing safer bicycle and pedestrian access along the MD 182 corridor. The proposed path will eliminate existing bicycle/pedestrian infrastructure gaps along the corridor while establishing multi-modal links between local cultural resources.

about the preliminary design plans, inform you of the project schedule and obtain your feedback.

PROJECT SCOPE AND PURPOSE

The proposed project will provide 1,400 feet of new ten (10') foot wide shared use path with five (5') foot grass buffer on the east side of Dr. Bird Road from MD 108 to the existing shared use path at Lake Norwood Way. The proposed project will also provide 1,700 feet of new ten (10') foot wide shared

use path with five (5') foot grass buffer on the east side of Norwood Road from the Sandy Spring Adventure Park to Ednor Road, where it will cross and connect to the existing shared use path on the south side of Ednor Road. The project will also include improvements to storm drainage, stormwater management, signing, pavement markings, and pedestrian signals.

PROJECT NEED

s part of the Countywide Bikeways Program MCDOT identifies missing links in off road shared use paths and on road bike lanes and initiates projects to eliminate the missing links (see map on back).

The Approved and Adopted Olney Master Plan and the Montgomery County Bicycle Master Plan identify Dr. Bird / Norwood Road (MD 182) as an important north/south connection for communities in Olney and Rockville, as well as a critical link for bicycle/pedestrian infrastructure along the MD 182 corridor.

As part of the planned Heritage Triangle Trail, the project will complete the shared use path network connecting several existing Maryland Heritage Sites along the MD 182 corridor.
