


■ Flash BRT Is Coming To Veirs Mill Road

Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) is getting ready to build the Veirs Mill Road Flash BRT. The project will enhance transit speeds and improve safety for pedestrians and cyclists.

The project design is now complete. Property acquisition and utility construction work have started. Small portions of property need to be temporarily or permanently purchased to build the project, but no residences or businesses will be acquired.

MCDOT will meet with the community in Fall 2025 as we progress the construction of the project. We will be holding events and speaking with community members to provide updates.




Improvements on Veirs Mill Road will Benefit All Users

Residents and travelers will experience a variety of improvements including:


- Faster transit service

Moving Toward Construction

The Veirs Mill Road Flash BRT project reached a major milestone in September 2025 with final design complete, utility work underway, and property acquisitions in progress.



Property Acquisition Process

Implementing the transit, bicycle, and pedestrian improvements will require Montgomery County to purchase small portions of property along the corridor. Most properties will not be affected, but the County may need to purchase rights to permanently or temporarily use some private property adjacent to the roadway. These rights are called easements. No residences or businesses need to be acquired. Outreach to property owners started in February 2025.

What to Expect During the Property Acquisition Process:
