

I commend you all on the proposed bridge replacement. We need every road/bridge update to follow this as a template by the way it provides both ample travel lanes for motor vehicles while giving save accommodations to bicyclists and pedestrians. I'm inserting an image I marked up that suggests we create shared used paths on both sides so as a cyclists I could ride on either side. Riding on a 6' shoulder sounds great, but I don't want my kids riding there. Having a SUP on both sides prevents crossing the road unnecessarily to access the SUP plus having a SUP makes for a nice large area to either walk or bike, and generally the SUP is asphalt, providing a smoother ride. If the SUP were to be concrete, then I suggest making the "slabs" as long as possible to reduce discomfort for bicyclists, scooters, etc. I'm suggesting that the 6' shoulders be reduced to 3' and give the extra space to the SUP/sidewalk areas. The idea here is that no bicyclists or pedestrian wants to be on the road anyway, so why even waste time/money designing for that case.
