2	MR. DORSEY: Good evening. It's
3	Wednesday, February 19th, 2020. And the time is
4	approximately 7:10. We are assembled here in the
5	all-purpose room of Farmland Elementary School
6	located at 7000 Old Gate Road, Rockville,
7	Maryland, 20852.
8	My name is Richard Dorsey, designee at
9	this hearing for the Montgomery County Department
10	of Transportation.
11	Here with me this evening to conduct
12	this a public hearing is Tim Cupples, chief of
13	the division of transportation engineering for the
14	Department of Transportation; and Frank Kingsley,
15	manager of the annual sidewalk program in the
16	division of transport engineering. Mr. Cupples
17	will provide the information and details regarding
18	the proposed project.
19	Tonight we are broadcasting this hearing
20	over the internet, and a recording will be made as
21	well. The recording will be available for viewing
22	by noon tomorrow. If you would like to view the
23	recording, please contact Lori Main, who is in
24	front and operating a webcam. Lori's contact
25	information is available at the sign-in desk as

1	you enter the room and will be repeated at the
2	conclusion of this hearing.
3	I hope everyone in attendance tonight has
4	signed as they entered the room and noted on the
5	sign-in sheet whether or not they wish to present
6	oral testimony. If you have indicated that you do
7	not wish to speak but change your mind during the
8	hearing, there will be an opportunity for you to
9	speak at the end.
10	Written comments may be submitted as well
11	and will be considered at the same weight as oral
12	testimony. If you have not signed in yet, please
13	do so before leaving this evening. Thank you.
14	This public hearing is being held pursuant
15	to Section 49-53 of Montgomery County Code. The
16	purpose of this public hearing is to obtain
17	testimony regarding potential projects to assist
18	in determining if the project is in the best
19	interest of the public and whether or not it
20	should be authorized for construction in its
21	entirety or any portion thereof.
22	This forum allows you to provide testimony
23	either in support of or opposed to the project.
24	Your comments should be focused entirely on the
25	project, which is the topic of this discussion.

1	All interested persons are entitled to be
2	here at this hearing. However, this is not a form
3	of dialog, questions and answers, or
4	cross-examinations. Please direct your remarks to
5	the specific project that is the subject of this
6	hearing. If your comments stray into areas not
7	related to this project, I will ask you to refocus
8	your comments to the subject project.
9	Following the conclusion of this public
10	hearing, the record will remain open for two to
11	three weeks to allow any person who is unable to
12	attend this hearing an opportunity to have their
13	comments included in the public record and be
14	fully considered.
15	The official closing date will be
16	announced at the end of this hearing. Submissions
17	may be faxed, email, or sent via regular mail and
18	must be received or post-marked by the close of
19	the hearing record. Written submissions will be
20	considered with the same weight as oral
21	testimonies. Submissions should be sent to
22	Ms. Main, whose contact information is at the
23	sign-in table.
24	After the conclusion after the hearing
25	is concluded, excuse me, and the record is

1	officially closed, I, as the hearing officer, will
2	review and weigh all information submitted into
3	the public record and make a recommendation to the
4	director of the Department of Transportation,
5	Chris Conklin, for his final decision as to
6	whether the project has been shown to be in the
7	best interests of the public and whether or not to
8	authorize the project as proposed or any portion
9	thereof.
10	Now, to discuss the sidewalk proposal for
11	Farmland Drive, Tim Cupples.
12	MR. CUPPLES: Good evening, Mr. Dorsey,
13	Mr. Kingsley, ladies and gentlemen.
14	The subject of this evening's public
15	hearing is to consider a proposal to construct a
16	5-foot wide concrete sidewalk and a variable 0- to
17	3-foot green space along the western side of
18	Farmland Drive from Old Stage Road to
19	Race Horse Lane.
20	For your convenience, we have provided a
21	few displays that aid in the visual description of
22	the project.
23	They are Display A, an aerial project
24	vicinity map showing the location of the proposed
25	sidewalks relative to nearby pedestrian tractions

1	such as schools, parks, public transportation, and
2	the existing network of sidewalks. The proposed
3	sidewalk is shown in red, and the existing
4	sidewalk is in blue. The total length of new
5	sidewalk construction will be approximately 1,050
6	total linear feet.
7	Display B is a typical section of the
8	proposed sidewalks on Farmland Drive, which has
9	60 feet of public right-of-way, the roadway being
10	36-feet wide. Thus there is approximately 12 feet
11	of public right-of-way available from the center
12	of the road on either side of Farmland Drive.
13	I'll now discuss the project
14	justification.
15	MCDOT evaluates requests for pedestrian
16	facilities based upon their ability to serve a
17	public use as well as their ability to enhance
18	public safety. The main goal for installing a
19	sidewalk is to remove pedestrians from the path of
20	vehicular traffic and create separation between
21	the pedestrian and the roadway.
22	New sidewalks on Farmland Drive will
23	remove pedestrians as well as disabled persons
24	from the roadway. The sidewalk will establish
25	safer access to all areas of the community

1	including this school, churches, middle and high
2	schools, and public transportation. Pedestrian
3	safety will be improved for the entire community.
4	I will now discuss tree removal and
5	replacement.
6	The removal of one tree is anticipated to
7	facilitate the construction of this entire
8	project. Three trees will be planted to replace
9	the one tree removed. Placement of the new trees
10	is selected by the County's arborist. The tree
11	protection report for each proposed roadway can be
12	viewed in the record binder at the sign-in table
13	under Exhibit 5. Copies of the tree protection
14	report will be mailed to residents on June 11th,
15	2019.
16	I will now discuss the cost and
17	assessments. The estimated cost for entire the
18	estimated cost for installing this entire project
19	is \$119,168.40. This includes construction,
20	inspection, and administrative costs. Funding for
21	this project will be provided under the County's
22	annual sidewalk program, CIP Project
23	Number 0506747.
24	There are no properties which are
25	considered to be specially benefitted by the

1	proposed improvement; therefore, no properties are
2	expected to be assessed.
3	I will now discuss the exhibits.
4	As previously discussed, several exhibits
5	are incorporated into the public record binder for
6	your information and consideration. The exhibits
7	are located in the red binder located on the
8	sign-in table by Ms. Main's contact information.
9	These exhibits include: (1) office of management
10	budget sidewalk program minor projects,
11	Project 506747, (2) project location maps,
12	(3) construction impacts, (4) cost estimates,
13	(5) arborist's tree evaluation reports, (6) proof
14	of publication from the Washington Post and
15	Go Montgomery press release each advertising this
16	public hearing, (7) correspondence and comment
17	forms supporting the proposed sidewalks,
18	(8) correspondence and comment forms opposing the
19	proposed sidewalks including a petition to save
20	the trees, (9) written testimony provided at the
21	hearing. If anyone has any written testimony, you
22	may give it to Ms. Main. (10) public hearing
23	sign-in sheet which will be added following this
24	hearing, and (11) the public hearing transcript
25	which will be added following this hearing as

2	Project related data and files have been
3	available for examination in the offices of MCDOT
4	located on the 4th floor of the Public Safety
5	Building, 100 Edison Park Drive, Gaithersburg,
6	Maryland, 20878.
7	The files will be continued to be
8	available to be public until the record for this
9	public hearing is officially closed. These files
10	are available for review by contacting the annual
11	sidewalk program at 240-777-7271 and making an
12	appointment.
13	If the proposed sidewalks are approved,
14	MCDOT will utilize a work order contract currently
15	in place with the division of transportation to
16	construct the sidewalk. If this project is
17	authorized, we anticipate construction in the
18	summer of 2020. The construction is anticipated
19	to take approximately three to four weeks to
20	complete if authorized as presented.
21	As previously stated, here with us this
22	evening is Mr. Frank Kingsley, manual manager
23	of the annual sidewalk program. He will be
24	available after the hearing to answer any
25	questions regarding the construction aspects of

1 this project. 2 I will now turn things back over to 3 Mr. Dorsey. 4 MR. DORSEY: All right. Thank you, 5 Mr. Cupples. 6 We will now hear comments from those in 7 attendance who want to testify. Please note 8 tonight's public hearing pertains to 9 Farmland Drive. Please focus your testimonies on 10 Farmland only. 11 If you are here to support the sidewalk 12 installation on Hitching Post Lane or 13 Old Gate Road, please see Ms. Main at the 14 conclusion of this hearing. Please clearly 15 provide your name and address for the public 16 record when you begin your testimony. 17 First person to come up is Ed Rich. 18 MR. CUPPLES: If you want to come up, 19 would you stand -- or sit right there so that the 20 stenographer can --21 MR. RICH: Right here? 22 MR. CUPPLES: Yes, if you wouldn't mind. 23 State your name and address for the record. 24 MR. RICH: Okay. Thank you all. My name 25 is Ed Rich. I live at 11703 Hitching Post Lane.

1	But I am also appearing here as the president of
2	the Greater Farmland Civic Association.
3	I'll start my written testimony.
4	Mr. Dorsey, Mr. Kingsley, and Mr. Cupples, I am
5	Ed Rich, the president of the Greater Farmland
6	Civic Association, which represents over 3,000
7	residents in the Old Farm, Tilden Woods, Hickory
8	Woods, and Walnut Woods neighborhoods.
9	The GFCA board supports the Montgomery
10	County Department of Transportation's
11	recommendation to construct the sidewalk segment
12	within the public right-of-way on the west side of
13	Farmland Drive between Old Stage Road and
14	Race Horse Lane.
15	In our continuing effort to improve the
16	safety of our resident walkers and bikers, on
17	August 15th, 2018, the GFCA board submitted a
18	formal request to the sidewalk division of MCDOT
19	to consider construction of this sidewalk segment.
20	As you know, when the community was formed
21	in the early to mid '60s, sidewalks were
22	constructed on our primary streets in most cases
23	on both sides of the street. For some reason,
24	unlike our other primary streets, a sidewalk was
25	only constructed on one side of that portion of

1	Farmland Drive that is considered a primary
2	street, and no sidewalk was constructed between
3	Old Stage Road and Race Horse Lane.
4	Farmland Drive is a main route to and from
5	Farmland Elementary School and is heavily utilized
6	each school day by Farmland students walking or
7	biking to and from school as well as by school
8	buses and parents or caregivers driving students
9	to and from Farmland. Moreover, even during
10	non-school hours, Farmland Drive is heavily
11	utilized by walkers and bikers as well as
12	vehicles.
13	Because the segment does not contain a
14	sidewalk, walkers and bikers typically walk in the
15	street and are forced into the middle of the
16	street due to parked vehicles creating a very real
17	conflict between vehicular and pedestrian traffic
18	on a stretch of road that has two major curves, a
19	major grade change, and no stop signs. Because of
20	the curves, sight lines for drivers are
21	compromised creating a real possibility of a
22	serious injury due to walkers and bikers using the
23	road in the absence of a sidewalk.
24	This segment needs a sidewalk to create a
25	safe passageway to and from Farmland Elementary

1	School and for the safety of our community. We
2	joined with the Farmland Elementary School PTA,
3	who I believe will be testifying later, and the
4	Farmland Elementary School principal, who I
5	believe was not able to be here tonight but may be
6	submitting written testimony, in supporting
7	construction of this missing sidewalk segment and
8	urge you to move forward for the safety of our
9	residents and our students.
10	Thank you.
11	MR. DORSEY: Diana Keohane, please state
12	your name and address.
13	MS. KEOHANE: Good evening. My name is
14	Diana Keohane. I live at 11802
15	Hitching Post Lane.
16	I would like to support or voice my
17	support for the installation of sidewalks on
18	Farmland Drive as planned. While I'm disappointed
19	that Hitching Post Lane was removed from
20	discussion prior to the hearing, I wholeheartedly
21	support the addition of sidewalks on the primary
22	and busy roadway of Farmland Drive.
23	With more and more parents both working
24	outside the home and our lives getting busier and
25	busier, traffic volume has increased significantly

in recent years, in my opinion.
Traffic generated by residents and parents
of children at Farmland Elementary is compounded
by a number of factors: At least four trash
collection companies each doing at least two
pickups a week; school buses with routes directing
them down Farmland Drive, both with and without
stops on the road; on-demand delivery companies;
and UPS and FedEx delivery trucks.
As we all know, distracted drivers and
pedestrians only make matters worse by looking
down at their phones and/or speeding. I often see
children getting off the bus looking down at the
their phones, not paying attention to the cars
around them.
In 2019, 13 pedestrians were killed and
580 were struck in Montgomery County. In by
early February of 2020, four pedestrians have been
killed and 60 have been struck. We would hate to
see this stretch of road be the location of
another significant pedestrian accident.
Understanding that the width of green
space is at the discretion of MCDOT, I would
encourage you to explore minimizing the width to

yard space for the residents of Farmland Drive. 1 2 Thank you. MR. DORSEY: Alicia Goldstein. 3 4 MS. GOLDSTEIN: Hi. My name is Alicia 5 Goldstein, and I live at 7020 Old Stage Road, and 6 I'm here because I support the sidewalk on 7 Farmland Drive. 8 I live on Old Stage Road, and either 9 myself or my husband walk my daughter to school 10 every single day, and we go down Farmland Drive. And we are often jumping onto the sidewalk to 11 12 avoid cars or buses and -- or not on the sidewalk, on the curb, because it's sometimes unsafe. 13 And as said before, there are several 14 15 curves, and at that point there's often cars on 16 those curves. And the sidewalk would definitely 17 help in making it a safe route to school for 18 myself and my daughter. 19 MR. DORSEY: Thank you. 20 John Marchant. 21 MR. MARCHANT: I'm John Marchant, and I 22 live at 11816 Farmland Drive. 23 So my wife and I have been here 25 years, and we raised two sons who safely walked with 24 25 their friends to Farmland Elementary as well as

1	down to the bus stop to go to Tilden Middle School
2	as well as Walter Johnson.
3	We are opposed to the sidewalk
4	installation. Some of our objections include the
5	project does not need the stated purpose of safer
6	access. That according to your letter of
7	June 11th, it was the objective was to provide
8	safer access for disabled, improving pedestrian
9	access to schools, nearby public transportation,
10	or public facilities is a major goal of the annual
11	sidewalk program.
12	However, as we know, Hitching Post and
13	Old Gate were removed from that proposal based on
14	community opposition, and so we're left with
15	Farmland Drive. And also the proposal did not
16	include areas south of Farmland Drive after Tilden
17	Lane.
18	And knowing from my many years of walking
19	dogs, there's more kids down there walking to that
20	bus stop than there are that pass in front of our
21	house. So I'll provide this testimony also to
22	the Ms. Main, who has been very helpful. I've
23	contacted her twice.
24	Additionally, I think it's good to note
25	that I think the origin of this was Ed Rich, who

1	previously spoke, the president of the Farmland
2	Association. He had reported that he received
3	requests for sidewalks from one resident of
4	Old Gate and several residents of
5	Hitching Post due to a resident's grandchild
6	darting into the street in front of an oncoming
7	car and had been slightly injured. Mr. Rich noted
8	the lack of a sidewalk did not contribute to the
9	accident.
10	I wholeheartedly my wife and I
11	wholeheartedly support pedestrian safety. And to
12	the best of my knowledge, no pedestrian fatalities
13	have occurred in small neighborhoods or
14	communities such as Old Farm. The proposal for
15	sidewalks on Hitching Post and Old Gate I
16	mentioned it was relieved due to community
17	opposition.
18	And then I can think of many other
19	examples of areas that they need sidewalks,
20	particularly around the new or what will be
21	Tilden school as well as Luxmanor. There's
22	nothing on Cushman Drive, north of
23	Cushman Drive excuse me north of Tilden
24	Lane. Tuckerman Lane has no from Luxmanor to
25	Marcliff has no sidewalk. Rosedale Drive leading

1	to Luxmanor has no sidewalk as well. Seems like
2	they're much more deserving candidates than what
3	we currently need.
4	So personal observation, I typically work
5	in Arlington, Virginia, and my hours are such that
6	I'm not typically at home between 7 to 6 p.m. And
7	however today I teleworked, and I observed the
8	number of children and adults walking on the
9	Farmland Drive to and from the Farmland Elementary
10	School this morning and this afternoon.
11	So from 8:50 to 9:25, children walking on
12	Farmland Drive to Farmland Elementary this morning
13	were six. Children, two parents, two dogs. Other
14	notes, they and two children walked on lawns,
15	which I think is great, and two walked across the
16	opposite side of the street.
17	So cars that were traveling in-bound on
18	Farmland Drive towards the school I counted 21,
19	17 of which were speeding and only four were doing
20	the speed limit. I don't have a measurement, but
21	I can tell when a car is going well over 25 miles
22	per hour.
23	So County school buses towards Farmland
24	Elementary School were four.
25	So then in the afternoon from 3:45 to 4:20

1	children walking from Farmland Elementary School
2	was five, and then County school buses to Farmland
3	were six.
4	And then coming back out sorry, cars
5	going in-bound again this is in the afternoon
6	towards the school. They could have been going
7	somewhere else in the neighborhood were 20.
8	And then cars traveling away from the school area
9	were 18.
10	County school buses on Farmland were five
11	coming in, and then driving away were four.
12	So the developers of Old Farm subdivision,
13	many other neighboring subdivisions such as
14	Luxmanor, Old Georgetown Estates, et cetera,
15	didn't envision a community with sidewalks on all
16	streets. And residents purchased homes in this
17	area and chose their home because of the not have
18	sidewalks.
19	So the other point I wanted to make if
20	and if I'm imagining I'm one of the few that are
21	opposed to this. But in any event, if you
22	continue with this installation of sidewalks, I
23	have a question. I know you can't address that
24	now.
25	But will homeowners be compensated with a

1	lower tax assessment for the property seized by
2	eminent domain.
3	So and in summary, president excuse
4	me pedestrian safety is vitally important to
5	our community as well as Montgomery County. I
6	totally support that. And for years I've lived
7	here, children and adults, parents, have been able
8	to walk safely throughout the neighborhood.
9	And last point I just want to make is very
10	few I've lived anyway my wife and I, very
11	few children walk to elementary school. No
12	pedestrian has been harmed walking on Farmland
13	Drive. I hope there never is. And I think the
14	primary I think there's other areas,
15	communities within Montgomery County that
16	definitely need sidewalks over an upgrade to the
17	current infrastructure from what they have. And I
18	can see that.
19	Lastly, to me the clear and pressing
20	danger in terms of safety in our community is the
21	cars speeding in our community. And I know you
22	can't address that but I'll try and meet with
23	Ed Rich and try and come up with other proposals,
24	because I requested a stop sign, and this man told
25	me that wasn't your department, and you couldn't

1	help me on that.
2	So I conclude my remarks. Thank you.
3	MR. DORSEY: Olya Dougherty.
4	MS. DOUGHERTY: Hi. My name is Olya
5	Dougherty, and my address is 7013 Old Stage Road.
6	I'm a parent of two children, one of whom
7	is a student in this Farmland Elementary School,
8	and my second child is will be starting
9	Farmland Elementary in August 2020 this year.
10	We are not provided a bus by Montgomery
11	County public schools because of our proximity to
12	Farmland Elementary. We are exactly two blocks
13	from the school, and we are supposed to be and
14	we're called in the school walkers.
15	We do not walk to school because of this
16	particular part of Farmland Drive, which I
17	consider to be not safe for small children to
18	walk. It has curves. It has elevation.
19	Therefore, I walked from my school to this
20	meeting from my house to this meeting, and I
21	didn't feel safe as an adult. And small children
22	cannot be relied of making smart decisions on the
23	roads at least the students of elementary schools.
24	The small amount of kids using this road
25	that was brought up previous by previous

1	speakers can be explained by families like us who
2	choose to drive two blocks to school rather than
3	using this particular part of the road that does
4	not have sidewalks and therefore not safe for
5	children and for families.
6	This is the end of my testimony to support
7	sidewalk on Farmland Drive.
8	MR. DORSEY: Thank you.
9	Andrew Clayton.
10	MR. CLAYTON: With respect to the Farmland
11	Drive project, [indiscernible].
12	MR. DORSEY: Hofman.
13	MS. HOFMAN: Good evening. My name is
14	Dorigen Hofman. I live at 6800 Breezewood
15	Terrace. I am speaking tonight as the president
16	of the Farmland Elementary PTA, which represents
17	more than 200 member families.
18	Farmland Elementary School has more than
19	850 students, many of whom walk to school using
20	the neighboring roads including Farmland Drive.
21	Farmland's PTA supports the recommendation to
22	construct a sidewalk segment on the west side of
23	Farmland Drive between Old Stage Road and Race
24	Horse Lane.
25	One of our PTA's main purposes is to

1	support our school and its students well-being and
2	safety. We strongly encourage the County to move
3	forward with building a sidewalk on this segment
4	of road in order to allow students to walk to
5	school more safely.
6	In addition to serving on the PTA, I walk
7	my children to school daily. We cross
8	Farmland Drive at Race Horse Lane and see school
9	buses, delivery vans, and cars driving down this
10	section of Farmland Drive. We also see children
11	and adults walking this section in the street
12	trying to stay safe despite the passing of traffic
13	on a curved busy street. I have witnessed several
14	pedestrian accidents and near misses while walking
15	to and from school particularly on Farmland Drive.
16	Additional sidewalks additional sidewalks will
17	increase pedestrian safety while encouraging
18	people to walk to school and within the
19	neighborhood.
20	Finally, Farmland Drive is a primary
21	street with double yellow lines and is a main
22	route to school for many vehicles including school
23	buses. Currently due to the lack of sidewalks,
24	many buses have been routed onto Magruder and Race
25	Horse Lane, narrow secondary streets that do

1	that do have sidewalks.
2	This often results in traffic jams on
3	narrow streets from parked cars, school buses, and
4	other vehicles. It also means buses are turning
5	left onto Farmland Drive without a four-way stop
6	and regularly almost causing collisions with
7	oncoming vehicles. We see this at least once a
8	week if not more often.
9	With a new sidewalk, we can request that
10	school buses be more consistently routed via
11	Farmland Drive, which will improve traffic flow,
12	congestion, and overall safety within the
13	neighborhood.
14	The Farmland PTA believes this segment of

17	Greater Farmland Civic Association in urging you
18	to move forward in constructing a sidewalk for the

20	MR. DORSEY: Emily Mintz.
21	MS. MINTZ: Hello. I'm Emily Mintz. I
22	live at 6712 Sulky Lane.
23	I was planning to talk about another
24	project, so I just wanted to let you know that I
25	am in favor of this sidewalk project. I also want

2	dangerous to walk in the street. If there's any
3	snow and ice, that is just it's a recipe for
4	disaster. I will have walked that section of
5	Farmland Drive many times and have always just,

8	problem.
9	I have I'm a realtor. I have never
10	seen another street that has a double yellow
11	line that is a main residential street in this
12	County that I can recall that has no sidewalks on
13	it.

15	whom I've been communicating about Hitching Post.
16	MR. DORSEY: Thank you.
17	Victor Ban. Victor?
18	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Oh, Victor had to
19	leave.
20	MR. DORSEY: Okay. So this concludes the
21	speakers who have expressed interest in speaking
22	tonight. Is there anyone else that didn't sign
23	the sheet that would like to comment on Farmland
24	Drive?
25	Please state your name and address.

1	MS. GUDELSKY: My name is Meryl Gudelsky.			
2	I live at 11823 Farmland Drive, so I am affected			
3	by this.			
4	And I am definitely approval of having it.			
5	We didn't even walk here tonight because we didn't			
6	want to walk in the dark and have to walk in the			
7	street. There are plenty of children that are in			
8	the street. It's very unsafe. It is wintertime			
9	now, so not as many people are walking. But in			
10	the summer, spring, fall, there's loads of			
11	children.			
12	It's very unsafe. We talk walks in the			
13	neighborhood all the time, and it is wind-y. Cars			
14	can't see you. There's almost collisions. And I			
15	just want to say we absolutely are in favor of			
16	them putting in a sidewalk in.			
17	MR. DORSEY: Thank you. Okay. Thank you			
18	all for your oh, sorry.			
19	MS. LINKIE: My name is Amantha Linkie. I			
20	live at 11820 Farmland Drive.			
21	I am the parent of two middle school aged			
22	children who walk to school every day for their			
23	entire kindergarten through 5th grade time at			
24	Farmland. I did not like them walking by			
25	themselves because it was dangerous to have them

1	walk in the street. I also don't like them			
2	walking up in people's yards. I feel that that's			
3	not appropriate either.			
4	If there's a designated sidewalk, I think			
5	that would be great. I am very much in favor of a			
6	sidewalk, but would like to say that it's a much			
7	more agreeable idea if it's not 8 feet into the			
8	yard. You did say something along the lines of in			
9	certain situations there being some leeway about			
10	the 5-foot wide nature of the sidewalk. If it			
11	could be brought to something more a little less			
12	large, I think there would be more less			
13	opposition to it.			
14	I'd hate to see, you know, the call for it			
15	to meet ADA requirements end up meaning that it			
16	doesn't happen at all, that it's 5 feet or			
17	nothing. That, you know, 2 or 3 feet or whatever			
18	our current sidewalks are would probably be a lot			
19	more favorable to people.			
20	In the end, for me I think safety wins			
21	out. But 5 feet, 8 feet into my yard is a lot			
22	more than I'd really like to see.			
23	MR. DORSEY: Anyone else? Okay.			
24	Thank you for your testimonies. Seeing			
25	that everyone who wishes to speak has had an
