## SUSPENSION OF LEGAL TIME REQUIREMENTS

This notice is given by Marc Elrich, County Executive of Montgomery County, acting pursuant to the Proclamation of Governor Lawrence J. Hogan, Jr. (the "Governor") dated March 5, 2020 proclaiming a state of emergency and a catastrophic health emergency related to COVID-19, as it may be amended or renewed from time to time, and the Order of the Governor dated March 12, 2020 entitled "Extending Certain Licenses, Permits, Registrations, and Other Governmental Authorizations, and Authorizing Suspension of Legal Time Requirements", as it may be amended from time to time, after finding that the action(s) described herein will not endanger the public health, welfare, or safety.

The timeframes mandated under (1) Montgomery County Code ("MCC") § 24A-7(f), requiring the Historic Preservation Commission to make a public decision regarding the approval of a Historic Area Work Permit ("HAWP") application not later than 45 days after the applicant files the application or 15 days after the Commission closes the record on the application, whichever is earlier, and (2) MCC § 24A-10(d), requiring the planning board to render its findings and determinations with respect to an application for a permit to demolish or substantially alter the exterior features of any historic resource which is listed in the "Locational Atlas and Index of Historic Sites in Montgomery County, Maryland" within 60 days after the filing of the application or within 15 days after the closing of the record following a public hearing, whichever occurs later, are hereby suspended in accordance with the above-referenced March 12, 2020 Order of the Governor issued under Md. Code Ann., Pub. Safety § 14-107(d)(1)(i). Any effect of MCC §§ 24A-7(f) and 24A-10(d) inconsistent with the foregoing is hereby suspended.

This Notice is effective immediately and shall remain in effect until 30 days after the state of emergency has been terminated and the proclamation of the catastrophic health emergency has been rescinded.
