





COMMON CONCERNS SEEN BY EMSQA

The donut magnet is *only* used to disable an Implantable Cardioverter Defibrillator (ICD)



Use the Donut Magnet to disable an ICD when:

1. There have been 3 or more distinct ICD shocks AND there is an obvious device malfunction with at least one EMS witnessed inappropriate shock

OR

2. A patient has been TOR'd and the ICD is still firing

DO NOT use the Donut Magnet to:

- Disable a patient's pacemaker – that's not what its for
- Disable a <u>properly</u>
 <u>functioning</u> ICD for
 example, when the patient
 is in a shockable rhythm –
 even if you are
 resuscitating the patient

The ICD has wires directly into the heart and is possibly more effective than quik-combo pads where electricity must traverse the entire chest wall. Continue your resuscitation as normal, delivering shocks via your defibrillator but **allow the ICD to function as well**.
