Routine Transports to the Hospital Should be the Norm!



You deliver high-quality medicine to the patient.
Most times there is no need to rush to the hospital!



Sick means SLOW down

- Treat in place
- Stabilize
- Drive Slowly
- Drive Safely



If the patient requires a time-sensitive intervention only available at the hospital, *consider* Emergency Transport

Examples of Emergency Transports

- ✓ STEMI Alert
- ✓ Stroke Alert
- ✓ Alpha/Bravo Trauma
- ✓ Critical OB emergencies
 - Massive hemorrhage
 - Breach presentation
- ✓ Unable to oxygenate or ventilate
- ✓ Any other critically ill patient unable to be treated or stabilized
