“Welcome to the MICC”

- Formerly known as the ROCC, Metro operations have been relocated to a new facility called the Metro Integrated Command and Communications Center, or **MICC**. The facility has been moved from Landover to Alexandria, VA.
- Despite the facility change, the point of contact for us is still referred to as the ROCC Fire Liaison, or RFL.
 - To contact the RFL, best practice is to have ECC contact the MICC and have them come up on the operations channel.
 - The RFL is generally the most reliable resource we have during a metro incident, being that they are the party who normally generates the call and has direct access to all of the resources metro has to offer.
 - What the RFL can do to support incidents:
 - Shut down power or single-track trains around the incident
 - Share chain marker information
 - Access CCTV video cameras to get video reconnaissance
 - Request resources like Metro Transit Police and Emergency Response Teams (ERT)
 - Manage and communicate ventilation plans with fire and rescue personnel
