2010 FIRE INCIDENT INFORMATION


During the Calendar Year 2010, there were 1,640 actual fires reported. Of the 728 structure fires reported, 488 of them occurred in dwellings. There were 291 vehicle fires. The total fire loss reported in Montgomery County for CY 2010 was \$32,698,533. This is a decrease of 25% over calendar year 2009. Structure fires accounted for \$30,270,136 of the loss and vehicle fires accounted for \$2,119,552 of the loss. In addition, there were 621 vegetation and outside fire which had a fire loss of \$308.845.

There were 2 civilian fatalities during Calendar Year 2010. The both fatalities were occurred at the area of fire origin. There were no fatalities of fire service personnel during Calendar Year 2010.

There were 48 civilians who suffered fire-related injuries during Calendar Year 2010. Civilian Casualty reports were filed for 47 of the civilian casualties. According to the civilian casualty reports that were filed, only 3 of the civilian casualties were asleep at the time of injury. Most of the civilian casualties were awake and unimpaired at the time of injury. Over one-third of the injuries occurred to civilians who were attempting to control the fire. Eighty-seven percent of the injured suffered burns and/or smoke inhalation. The ages of the civilian casualties ranged from 5 to 83 years. Seven of the injured were less-than or equal to 20 years of age and eight of the injured were equal or over 65 years of age.


There were 46 firefighters who suffered fire-related injuries during Calendar Year 2010. Fire Service Casualty reports were filed for 45 of the firefighter casualties. According to the reports that were filed, eleven of the casualties suffered burns; twelve of the fire casualties were classified as 'strain or sprain'. Of the remaining casualties, eight were classified as 'cut or laceration', four were classified as 'cardiac symptoms', and the rest were variously classified as 'crushing', 'pain only', 'minor trauma', 'exhaustion/fatigue, including heat exhaustion' and 'none'.

The following charts are summary of number of fire incidents by incident type (cleared as), total number of fire loss, and casualties.



MCFRS Fire Incident Summary by Incident Type (Cleared as)




MCFRS Fire Loss betwen 2005 and 2010
