- 3- Police Report
 - a. MCPS staff run Hate reports in different ways, making difficult to track issues.
 - MCPS counts with two different forms and procedures. There is not a universal knowledge on students, families, and MCPS staff on the forms and related procedures. MCPS is working on closing the knowledge gap. The forms are:
 - i. Bullying form
 - ii. Hate form
 - c. MCPS will count with a two-level training on hate/bias
 - i. Currently, mandatory compliance modules to be completed before class year start. If failure to completion, MCPS takes disciplinary action.
 - ii. During the summer, there will be additional modules on hate.
 - d. MCPD working with County Executive office in developing a system using the 311 line to receive and process hate incident claims.
