Liz Quinn

- Previously used her library degree with research institutes
- Decided to leave retirement to work part time as a Teen Librarian
 - Began May 9, 2022
- Is working with a teenager at Winston Churchill High School named Melissa to develop teen programming
 - On Earth Day (April 22, 2023), a scientist from NOAH(?) is going to give a talk about climate change
 - In May, having a scientist bring in microscopes
 - The author of How to They/Them, Stuart Getty, is going to do a presentation over Zoom talking about non-binary people and they/them pronouns in June
 - Later in the summer, an experienced Dungeon Master is going to come in and run a game of Quest (a tabletop roleplaying game like Dungeons and Dragons)
 - Exploring the possibility of bringing in Michelle Singletary to discuss personal finances
 - Question about doing book talks
 - It's difficult to market to teens
 - The County has just hired a Teen Program Manager who will be working on a teen advisory group
 - Exploring how to do a book of the month where teens are able to vote on the book
- Some previous book displays from 2022 include:
 - Roleplaying games
 - Dance appreciation month
 - Difficult child month
 - Women in music
- Upcoming book display for March 2023 is Women's History Month display
- Put out a suggestion box
 - Want an ice machine in the teen area
 - Want snacks available (sadly we can't do that, there was a mouse)

Regional Manager's Report

- Staffing
 - No big updates on staffing
 - The Library Desk Assistants are in the final stages of hiring, should be done soon
 - No one transferred into the Library Associate opening so that will be posted externally
- Administrative Updates
 - New Performance Management and Data Specialist, Weihua Zhao
 - First time having someone whose main job is dedicated to analyzing data and finding ways to use it
 - MCPL keeps a lot of data (though is careful not to keep personal data to maintain privacy) that should be able to improve library operations
 - New Teen Program Manager, Tyler Chadwell English
 - Always had someone specifically dedicated to children's and adult programming but never teens
 - Service to teens is one of the four goals in the strategic plan
 - Teens need more attention than they have been getting and this should be helpful to achieve that goal
 - Came on board about two weeks ago
- Programming
 - Amazing Animal Stories author program went very well
 - The program was advertised as a children's program but had a higher attendance by adults
 - Per the library's statistics, 53 people attended, 14 were children, the remainder were adults
 - This might have had a larger attendance of adults because the authors were selling their books, many adults were buying books that will presumably get to children
 - African Storyteller
 - This weekend showing the movie Soul as part of MCPL's Afro-futurism film series
 - Every branch except Noyes is taking part in this program
 - Connie Morella will be one of two libraries with children's movies
 - Children's programming in March
 - A craft program for making your own terrarium
 - Book Bingo
 - Connie Morella did not do a Lunar New Year program because two branches nearby (Chevy Chase and Davis) both had Lunar New Year programs
 - Trying to avoid competition between branches for events
 - Author talk with Jenny Mazzer on her book Maryland Freedom Seekers on the Underground Railroad
- Tax forms
 - We have the Maryland tax forms
 - Waiting on federal tax forms, IRS is being slow

- Mask and test distribution is going strong
- Facilities
 - Had a minor pest problem
 - Going to be stricter about eating in the library
- Statistics
 - Five storytimes, 351 total attendees
 - Lego program
 - Total number of attendees, how many are children
 - Previously there was a question about how many people are within the Connie Morella community
 - This is hard to define because libraries don't have boundaries the way a school does
 - This is considered a regional branch (6 branches are regional branches) but this is probably the smallest one
 - Smaller in physical size, more comparable in population
 - Connie Morella is somewhat comparable to Quince Orchard or Davis in terms of physical size and foot traffic but it's hard to compare branches
 - As figures for attendance in children's events have increased, have the number of children's books checked out also increased?
 - Kate isn't sure but that data does exist
- Linda went to speak with the English conversation club a couple weeks ago per Elisa's previous request

Jim Montgomery's Report from the Library Board

- Construction at the sister branch in Chevy Chase has been put off for two years to allow discussion as to how that land will be used
- Rockville LAC discussed difficulty in getting digital books
 - An Electronic Resources Librarian is being hired to try to help with digital access (county-wide position)
- The Board and FOLMC have sent a joint position paper to the County Executive
 - Advocate backing strategic priorities, getting more kids ready for kindergarten
 - A big part of this is more staffing
 - We will see if the County Executive has a role in getting children ready for kindergarten
 - We will know on March 15, 2023 if Anita's plans will be supported by the County Executive's proposed budget
- Potomac branch renovations is 90% done which affects the staff member we have on loan from them
- Anita is aware this branch wants more programming

LAC Chair's Report

- Bethesda Elementary School has 640 kids
 - 20% of those children are emergent multilingual learners
 - 10% of them are in Special Education

- 16% in free or reduced price lunch programs
- The school is majority-minority (43% white)
 - 16.4% Hispanic
- It's important to keep in mind that this area is not exclusively a white, affluent community, this library serves a diverse population
