The representatives from MCDOT let us know that a portion of parking *fees*, not fines, goes to the Urban District.

There was a lively discussion about ideas to improve traffic for businesses in Wheaton and to bring a more lively human presence to the Triangle. Most involved less draconian enforcement of meters, eliminating the requirement to pay meters after 6 PM, or allowing parking for longer times on some streets.
