Montgomery Parks Awarded \$900,000 Federal Transportation Alternative and Recreational Use FY25 Grant to Improve and Extend Damascus Trail

- Montgomery Parks has been awarded a \$900,000 grant from the Federal Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) to design the extension of the Margruder Branch Trail into downtown Damascus.
- The Magruder Branch Trail is a multi-use trail with 4.2 miles of asphalt and boardwalk and 3.3 miles of natural surface.
- The grant funding will be used to design a one-mile trails extension and replacements for sections of the existing boardwalk needing repair.
