Figueredo provided a budget update. Montgomery Parks has been busy defending their budget at the County Council. The County Executive's budget request made it difficult for Parks to maintain the same level of services budget. The proposed budget falls short by \$3M, initially it was at \$5M.

The County Executive sent a budget amendment of \$1M to pay for compensation. Some grass fields would be impacted – less fertilizer and irrigation, trash pick-up, other similar services. Scheduled renovations may get delayed or canceled altogether.

Discussion ensued regarding Parks' budget priorities.
