2. Sen. Jeff Waldstreicher

- a. On Oct. 1st, new juvenile justice reform measure went into effect
- b. Fentanyl issue, which is "uniquely dangerous" even in small amounts
- c. Increase use of drone program and license plate readers and people on the ground
- d. Previous reforms need time to go into effect and so not much leg. Activity less this year because much legislation happened last year which is this year being implemented.
- e. Pedestrian access/walkability is a priority.

- a. January 8th convening
- b. Increased time for early voting hours, 10am to 8pm now 7am to 8pm
- c. Increase number of polling places, issues related to mail voting
- d. Automatic voter registration for re-entering from state correctional facilities

- a. Resource adequacy/energy how do we do this so we don't have blackouts, plus growth on ratepayers, should we build more gas plants in MD?
 - i. Piedmont Reliability Project
- b. Mental health and public safety, lack of beds in hospitals. Where people can go once they are out of the hospital, with a criminal conviction.
- c. Discussed Purple line: it's way worse than any of us thought it would be and businesses/residents along the line are paying the price for the entire region. Looking into free ridership for people along the line, free advertising for businesses – looking for ideas.

- a. Ink is barely dry on juvenile justice reform measure, discussed gun violence-related penalties
- b. Inflation on everyone's minds: housing, childcare, and healthcare costs
- c. Revenue questions loom we continue to have no money for the big stuff and are in a world of serious financial constraints
