- Public Safety
 - Working with law enforcement, seeking to address economic insecurity and poverty to address crime concerns
 - Drone as first responder program
 - Working to repair police-community relations
 - Proposed a bill to eliminate consent searches in the absence of probable cause during traffic stops
- Housing
 - Rent stabilization passed last year
 - Regulations were transmitted to the Council last week, so it has not gone into effect yet
 - Exceptions for new developments and significant updates
 - Developer concerns are unlikely to materialize in terms
 - No data yet due to the implementation delay
 - New housing production fund \rightarrow invest in more, new types of housing
 - Attainable housing strategies (smaller, more dense units near transit corridors)
 - Supports the "ban-the-box" legislation for housing
- MCPS
 - New superintendent for MCPS
 - o 160,000 students
 - o 25,000 employees
 - Increasing needs in the system post-COVID
 - Career and tech programs \rightarrow protecting the Automotive Tech program at Damascus
 - Safe cross to schools
- Anti-Poverty measures
